

# Andrew Murray Motors Combines Housewarming With New Cars

While Andrew Murray Motors moved into their new Mountainview Road building in May, an official housewarming ceremony was delayed until the handsome new building was completely finished and landscaped.

Today he is inviting the public to view something of which he is justly proud — a huge 10,000 square foot building which includes showroom space for four cars of his Chevrolet-

Oldsmobile line.

Mr. Murray started in business here in 1956 as a Texaco station lessee. He added the Rexway service station later, and in 1963 embarked in the General Motors business when he took over the business on the highway formerly operated by Art Scott. He later added an Esso station to his growing business, which he still retains.

A native of Clydebank, Scot-

land, he was in Canada training with the Royal Air Force during the war, liked what he saw here and emigrated after the war, first to Toronto, and later to Georgetown.

He now employs a staff of twenty. Son Andy, Jr. is vice president and sales manager of the firm, and a married daughter, Mrs. Jim McGill is office manager.

## Will Pass Thousand Mark In Blood Packs Donated

Georgetown blood clinics will collect more blood from donors this year than last but it will take an extra clinic to do it. At a blood donor centre set up in the Holy Cross auditorium Monday donors added 259 more blood packs to their total for 1967 bring it to 901.

Last year, donors gave 905 packs of blood in three clinics, but this year the Georgetown Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society has scheduled a fourth clinic for December, which will put the total well

beyond the thousand mark.

This year so far donors gave 381 packs at the March clinic, 281 in June and 239 at the September clinic. The fourth will be held December 11.

Two hundred and seventy-one offered blood Monday, but 12 were rejected.

This was the second time for the clinic at Holy Cross. Previous clinics were in Knox Hall but the Red Cross Branch changed the location because of a parking problem.

## Soil Expert Held High Posts in Germany, Canada

A former Norval resident, who had held prominent positions with Canadian Industries Ltd., B. Leslie Emslie, 80, died recently in Guelph, where he had been a resident since 1933.

He was born Feb. 25, 1878, at Kenney, Aberdeenshire, Scotland; the son of Benjamin and Sarah Emslie. Mr. Emslie graduated from Glasgow University in chemical engineering in 1903. His life work was the development of the science of agricultural fertilizers. The first period of two years was spent in Germany with the German Potash Corp. In 1905 he came to Canada where he was appointed manager of the Potash Educational Bureau, which position he held from 1906 to 1914. When the First World War broke out, he was asked to head up the supervision of seaweed investigation at Sable Island, N.S. This was followed by a period from 1915-1922 when he was soil fertility specialist at the Dominion Experimental Farms at Ottawa.

He is survived by his wife, son James D., one sister, Anna Emslie of Guelph and a niece, Mrs. Jean Hammond of Abertoye.

He was predeceased by two brothers, Ernest and John and a sister Miss Emily Emslie.

Mr. Emslie was a member of the Chartered Surveyors' Institute, and a fellow of the Chemical Society of London, Eng., a life member of the Canadian Society of Technical Agriculturalists, member of the advisory board Dominion Fertilizer Act; member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a past president of the Agricultural Institute of Canada.

Mr. Emslie was author of many widely circulated bulletins on the subject of fertilizers, their composition and application and was also a contributor of general articles to the Farmers' Advocate and other periodicals.

In 1928 he was appointed technical promotion manager of the fertilizer division of Canadian Industries Ltd., in Montreal and also editor of the CIL Fertilizer News, which position he held until his retirement in 1947.

In 1915, he married Minnie Otten Crowell, daughter of Capt. and Mrs. Crowell, of Shelburne, N.S. They had two children, James D. of 51 Kensington St., Guelph, and Isobel Margaret, who predeceased him in 1954.

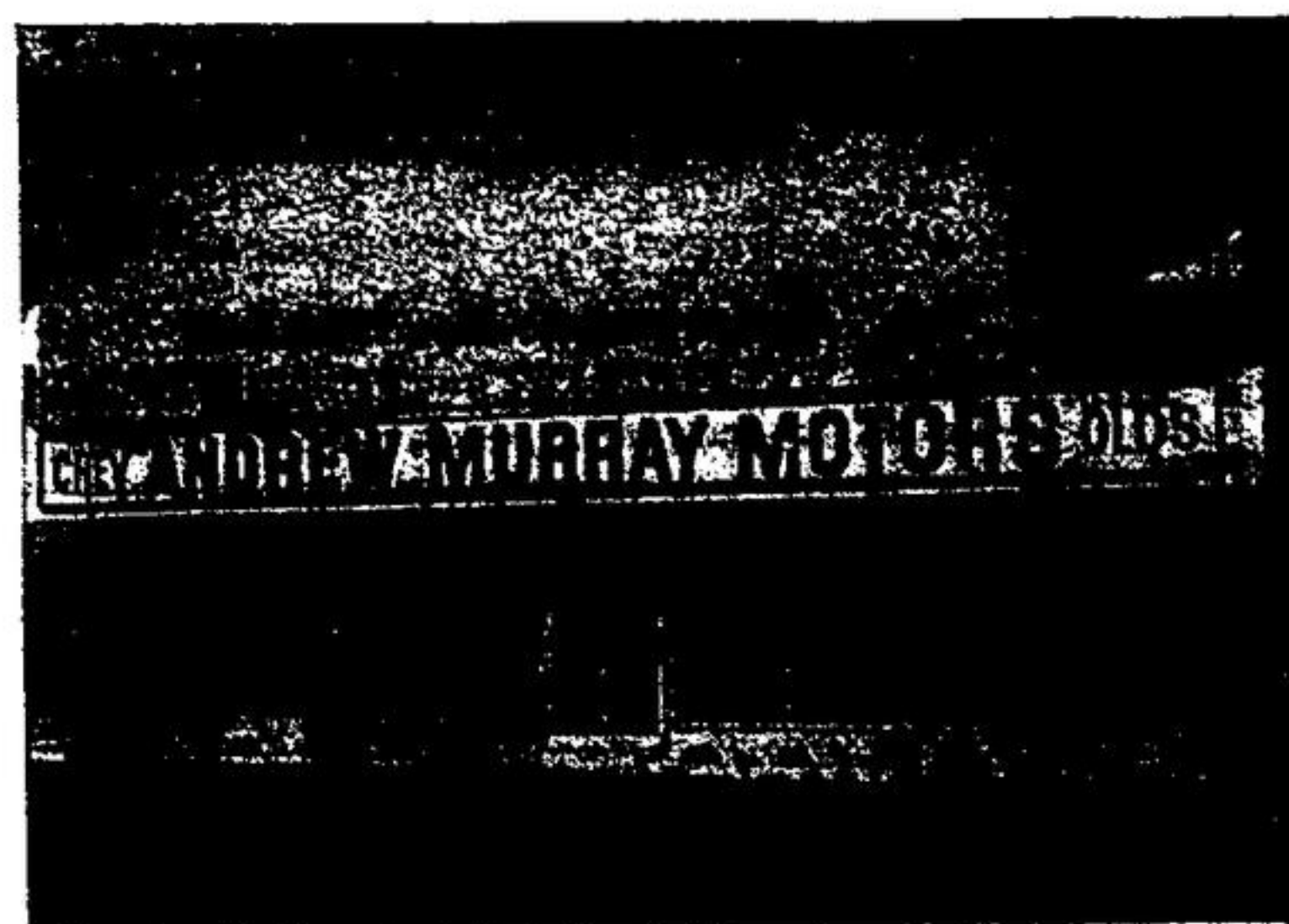
