GDHS Rebels Win Game with Brampton

Georgetown Rebels who are having their troubles winning a high school senior league football game showed they have the artillery in an exhibition tilt Friday when they rallied to beat Central Peel Secondary School 12-0.

Rebels put together a potent fourth quarter to overcome a 9-0 deficit when quarterback Bill Dwyer started picking holes in the Central Peel secondary.

In the dying minutes of the third quarter Dwyer hit Barry Cook in the end zone with a strike to start the comeback. That came after Bill Sykes, a tackle who is used to handle the third down punts, threw to Dwyer on a surprise move to gain an important first down.

Rebels front wall opened gaping holes on running plays and made a solid pocket for Dwyer when he took to the air. Dwyer passed to Cook for the 35 yard pass and play that gave them the lead.

Central Peel owned the football throughout most of the first half and much of the early going in the second stanza, but could produce only one major score.

They led 3-0 at half time on a single and a safety touch, and quarterback Bob Williamson hit Dave Wildfong and Bob Ernst with back to back long gainers the second one into the end zone.

Robertson gave up seven hits, and no walks and struck out 15. Holtby allowed five hits, no walks and whiffed 17.

Georgetown won the opening game of the best of five series Guelph took the next two with hits, and Georgetown dethroned the set with an extra inning victory Monday.

Week's Report for North Halton O.P.P.

During the week of September 24 to 30, personnel of the North Halton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, worked a total of 885 1/4 hours and patrolled 8,381 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol, 30 charges were preferred, 39 traffic warnings were issued, and 27 vehicles were safely checked. There were 68 convictions registered in Magistrate's Court, Milton.

There were 5 property damage accidents investigated and 6 personal injury accidents resulting in 9 persons being injured, and total property damage of \$5,810. Causes of accidents were: inattentive driving, wrong side of road, driver lost control and improper passing on hill. There were 6 charges laid as a result of these accidents.

There were 40 general occurrences reported during this period, including 2 assault investigations.

All occurrences were of a minor nature.
