Want New Councillor? Name One Says Mayor

"It's high time we filled the council vacancy," Deputy Reeve Arthur Speight told Mayor Gibbons Monday. "Have you the power to make or recommend the appointment? I would like some guidance."

There has been a Ward 2 council vacancy since Cr. Fred Harrison resigned several weeks ago to accept a position with the town.

Earlier at Monday's meeting a ratepayer, James McCaig told council an appointment is overdue.

"It must be putting a heavier load on councillors," he said, "and the load must be heavy because you have had a number of special meetings lately."

He said that Mayor Gibbons in his election platform last December had appealed for one more year as mayor so he could terminate his public life at the end of centennial year.

Mayor Gibbons declined comment on Mr. McCaig's statement.

But he told the deputy reeve that every council member is on equal ground in recommending a new council member.

"Pick your man and take the responsibility," he said. "I'm no sponge to be soaking in this talk of Ward 2 not being adequately represented. Every councillor is working for the town as a whole and not just for his own ward."
