Raiders in Exhibition Tilts This Week-end with Oakville

Georgetown Raiders will play a team relying heavily on youth and spirit when they play Oakville Oaks in OHA Central Jr. C League pre-season exhibition games this weekend. They go at it Friday night in Oakville and back here Sunday afternoon.

The success of the 1967-68 Oakville Blades hinges on the effectiveness of a couple of forwards turned defencemen and the continued success of the handful of veterans returning with the Junior C entry.

Coach Jack Rogers says his players are looking better every night and will be ready to give a good account of themselves in time for the season opener October 27th at the Oakville Arena where Orangeville are visiting.

With five lines and seven defencemen working out at camp, Rogers will have to cut his roster before next week.

While he feels the club will be strong offensively, a cloud of concern hovers over the defence.

Two of last season's effective wingers, John Scott and Gerry Gibson are working out in defensive slots. Rogers hopes this strategy may be the answer to the problem, created when none of last year's regular defencemen returned — mainly due to over-age.

Blades will be relying heavily on regulars Mike Kilpatrick, a steady centremen, top flight goalie Gerry Gobie, and Gord Armstrong, an 18-goal scorer last season.

Rogers figures the team is exceptionally strong in goal, with Noble looking as good as ever and newcomer Teddy Lemson looking real good. He feels the Blades are also exceptionally strong at centre.

If the defence is weak, says Rogers, it will be due to inexperience — nothing else.

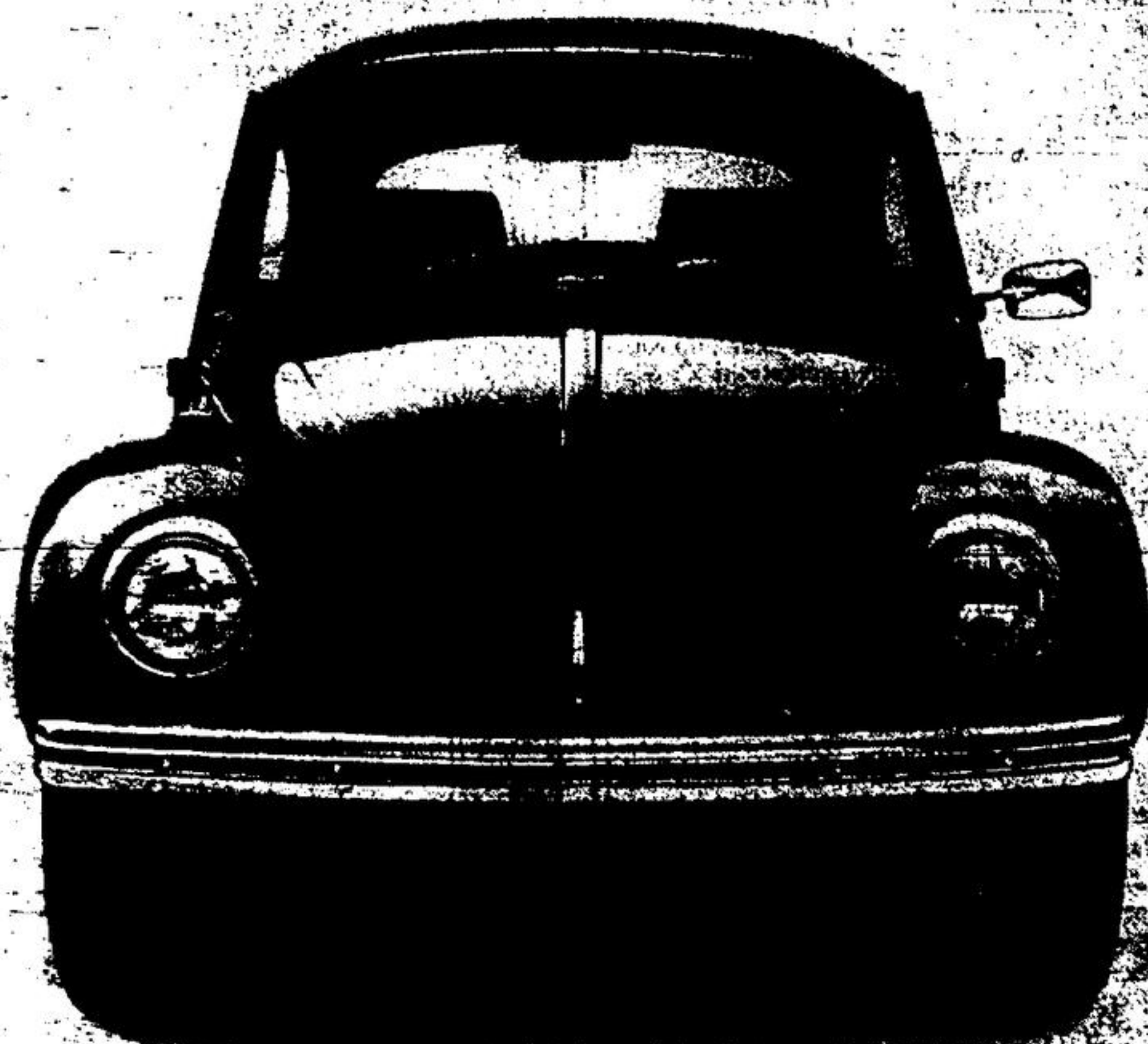
