KID HOCKEY STARTS SATURDAY

Hundreds of Scale Model Gordie Howes All Set to Go

The hockey season starts for boys to 800 kids in Georgetown Memorial Arena Saturday morning when the first games of the Region Minor Hockey schedule get under way. The NHL teams will look things up when they take the ice on Saturday, Oct. 14, to 9:45 a.m. Junior A teams will have the ice from then until noon, and American League teams move in at 12 and until 2 p.m. The complete weekend day schedule appears at the bottom of the column.

Players who have not registered for Region Minor Hockey but were on a team last season will have to register the first Saturday. Insurance is compulsory for the 1967-68 season for the price of a dollar.

Players in the Senior League, which starts Tuesday, Oct. 16, can also register at the arena Saturday. Coaches are still in demand and anyone interested in handling a senior league team is advised to leave their name with a member of the executive.
