South's leap to four hearts elosed out the bidding. With bis solid six tricks in trump, this was a good call.

Maybe West would have led a club anyway, I don't know. But after East's bid, there was no doubt. After the club lead declarer did not have a chance. West led the club nine and declarer played the five. On the second club led, declarer dropped the ten while West played the four.

Since West would lead low from four clubs, declarer is known to have another. A third club was taken and now the stage was set. Declarer appears to have 10 tricks, once he gets the lead. There are six trump tricks, three spades and the diamond acc.

One trick disappeared when East led his last club. Declarer ehose to play East for the heart ten and took a discard. West ruffed with the 10 for the setting trick. Even if declarer ruffs high the four one trump split
