Teresa Strates Plays Gretel

NEW YORK (AP) -- Toronto-born Teresa Stratas is a delightful Gretel in the Metropolitan Opera's new production of
Humperdinck's Hansel and
Gretel.

The diminutive soprano looked and acted like a flouncing young girl as she gave a convincing performance in the fairy tail work recently. Few other singers would fit the role so well.

Mezzo-soprano Rosalind Elias as Hansel was a boyishly able

foil for Miss Stratas' charm.

Baritone Karl Doench had the role of the witch, which usually is sung by a soprano or mezzo. Made up as an old bag he played the part with the sort of broad, child-appealing humor that you see in a puppet show, and the result was a strengthening of the characterization.

Designer Robert O'Hearn and director Nathaniel Merrill have collaborated to make this production fairly close to a movieland fantasy, pointing up the theatrical rather than the musical nature of the opera.

The scenes in the wordend are filled with Halloween hobgoblins, many of the costumes are bizarre, the stage effects are tricky, and the acting is exaggerated. For contrast there is one dream scene in which angels swoop down from the wings to stand guard over the lost children.
