Polished Performances In "Marriage Go Round" Play

A delightful, witty and polished performance was the Little Theatre's first show of the season Marriage Go Round.
An audience of approximately two hundred and fifty chuckled appreciatively as the four members cast, Mary Goebel as the seductive Swede, Karin Svea, Ron Hill, the object of her affections, Freda Grittani as the not so long suffering wife, and Eric Ming as an eager confidante, caught every nuance of the script.

Aiding greatly to the effect, was the presentation in dignified lecture form, with abrupt switches back to the action.
Ron Hill, Professor of Anthropology lectured on the perils of monogamy, while his wife Freda Grittani, Dean of Women illustrated the foibles of men. Mary Goebel as the gorgeous Swede maintained her air of innocent guile, even when draped only in a bath towel. She also managed to maintain her Swedish accent, no mean feat.

A complete set moving silently and easily on wheels, added to the smoothness of the changes and the no-curtain, just lighting changes kept the mood intact.
The effective sets were constructed by Gord Hunt, Gord Richardson, Bert Eade, and Liz Brown.
Incredible as it seems this was the twenty-second play shown here by the Little Theatre, since its inception in 1960. Some of the highlights of the past were "The Taming of the Shrew", "Rashomon", "Under the Sycamore Tree", "Little Hut", "Arsenic and Old Lace", "Oh Dad, Poor Dad", "Twelfth Night", "Bonaventure" and "A Little of what you Fancy". It was with the last mentioned that the Little Theatre broke into Toronto audiences at the Poor Alex.

Four Cars in Accident As Gale Topples Elm
A Glen Williams couple, Mr. and Mrs. John D. Wedgewood, escaped serious injury in a bizarre four car accident on Heart Lake Road near Bramalea, Sunday night.
One man Malcolm Cattanauch of Cooksville was taken to hospital with chest injuries as a result of the crash.
All four cars involved were travelling south on Heart Lake Road a half mile north of Highway 7 when a 60 foot elm tree blew to the ground in gale force wind. Hydro lines ignited the tree.
Most remarkable escape was by 20 year old Raymond Roberts of Brampton, in the second car on the scene. His sports hardtop struck the main trunk of the tree and flipped end over end to land right side up and travel another 60 feet into a ditch where it came to rest against a telegraph pole. Roberts climbed out unhurt.
First driver on the scene saw the flaming obstruction in time veered left and passed through the lighter branches with only scratches to the car.
The Glen Williams couple in the third car managed to stop the five yards from the tree. But seconds later a fourth car driven by Malcolm Cattanauch hit the rear of their vehicle.
Chinguacousy fire department removed the tree and put out the flames in less than an hour.
