## Three Months Before Hunt Figures Available

It will be three months before Dept. of Lands and Forests officials have accurate figures on the result of the recent deer hunt in Halton County.

Don Johnston, fish and wildlife supervisor for the Lands & Forests department's Huron district said: "We will eventually come up with a fairly exact estimate of how many deer were taken, but it will take quite a while to compile figures."

The process began while the three-day hunt was still in progress. Game wardens stopped hunters at random asking whether they had a farmer's license which can be used to hunt only in the county or a resident's license which can be used anywhere in Canada.

The ratio of resident licenses to farmer licenses in the sample group is then applied to the total number of farmer licenses issued in Halton County, the answer being a good estimate of the total hunting pressure for the county, Johnston said.

The sample hunters were also given a form to be mailed in informing the Dept. whether or not they killed a deer.

More than 3,000 forms were handed out in the 8,000 square mile Huron district and the percentage of successful hunters in this survey can be used to determine the total deer kill.

Although the figures are not yet in, all indications point to a very successful hunt in the Huron district and particularly in Halton County, Johnston said.

Most of the county's kill was made in the escarpment area of Nassagaweya Twp., he said.

"And one thing that might interest the people who were concerned the deer would be wiped out," Johnston said, "is that the hunt ended Wednesday and we had road kills (deer hit by cars) reported on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights."

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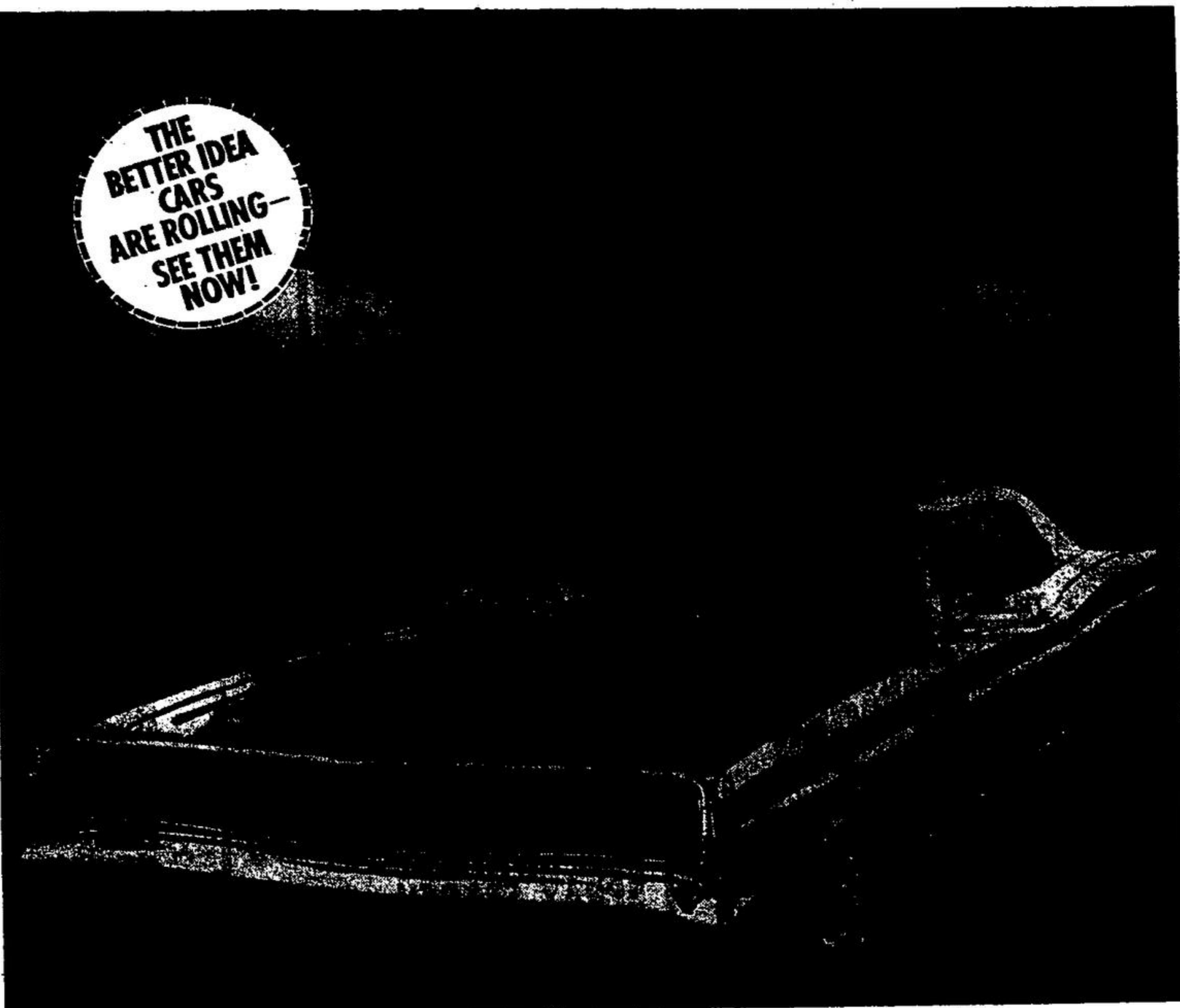
