## Penalties Predominate as Raiders Blank Miltonites

Led by Bill "Hummer" Dwyer, Georgetown Raiders blanked Milton Merchants 5-0 in a stormy OHA Suburban Junior C League tilt in Milton Friday night.

The game was interrupted by 35 penalties, 21 of them to the Raiders, however, Milton Merchants power play could do nothing about it.

Raiders scored twice in each of the first two periods and again in the third.

Included in the almost 80 minutes of penalties were three five minute fighting majors, a ten minute misconduct and a game misconduct.

Georgetown's Kent Robinson was slapped with two of the majors, and both misconducts when he went back into a fight a second time.

The game almost became a donnybrook but most Raider-Merchant skirmishes ended in roughing calls without solid punches being thrown.

Raider goalie Fred Cowbrough

gave Raiders their third consecutive shutout by turning aside 19 shots. He too was in on the rough stuff and drew four minutes for minor infractions.

Raiders' McMenemy and Milton's Hearn set the tone of the match when they were hauled off for roughing after just ten seconds of play.

Dwyer put Georgetown into a 1-0 lead from Paul Robinson with the teams at full strength at 13:56. A minute later, Terry Leswick from John Quackenbush and Jack Kemshead widened the gap.

Terry Hay made it 3-0 from Leswick and Phil Lavell with the strength even after a minute and 26 seconds of the middle period. Milton's Steve Gervais was on the penalty bench when Dwyer counted his second goal from Ron Lane, at 5 minutes.

Dwyer's third period goal, and the last of the game came at 13:55 of the final period with Milton's Hall penalized. Paul Robinson assisted.

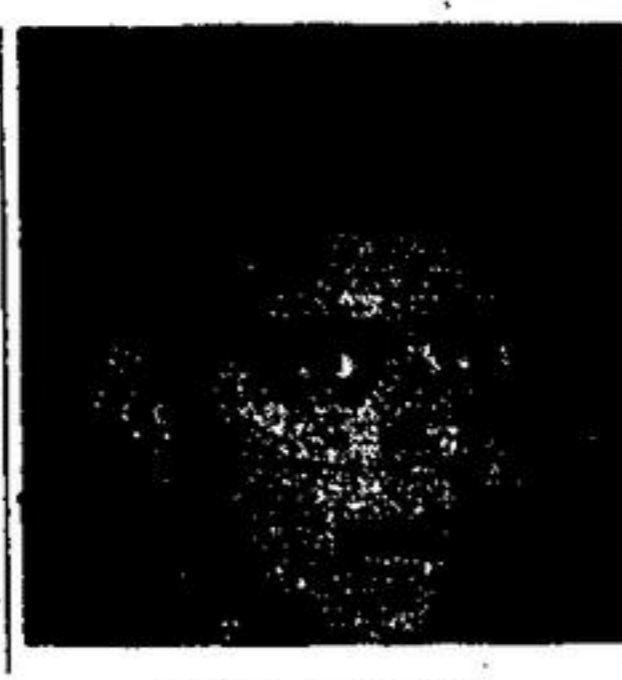
Don't forget Tuesday nights is PeeWee night in town.

In his years at Georgetown High, Mike Cummins played on the senior football squad and carried the Georgetown colours to the All-Ontario track and field finals two years in a row.

Mike was given the nod as the Most Valuable Player on the Georgetown Midget team which won the All-Ontario crown under coach Del Beaumont.

This week Cummins and his teammates will have their hands full as they travel to do battle with Cornell University of Ithaca, New York. Cornell last year won the American National Inter-Collegiate hockey title.

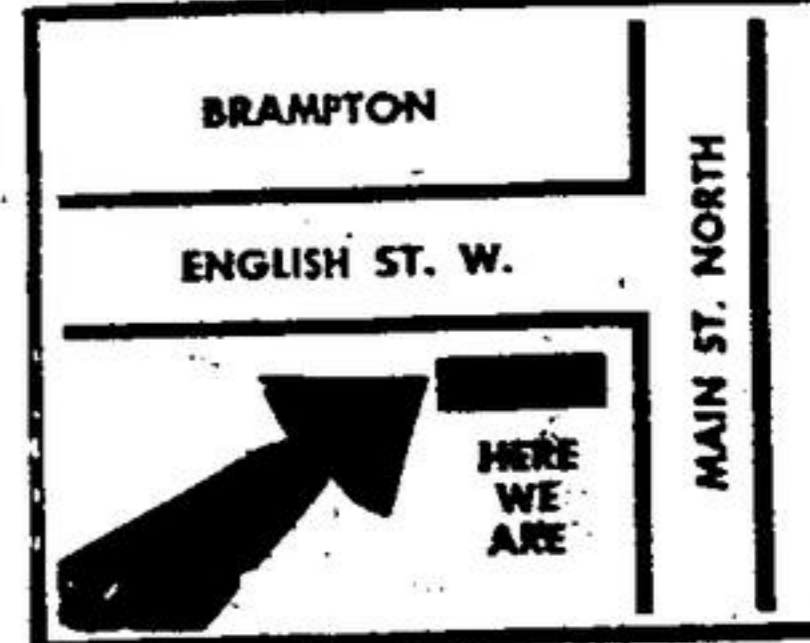
