Three Early Goals Give Hilkrons Win

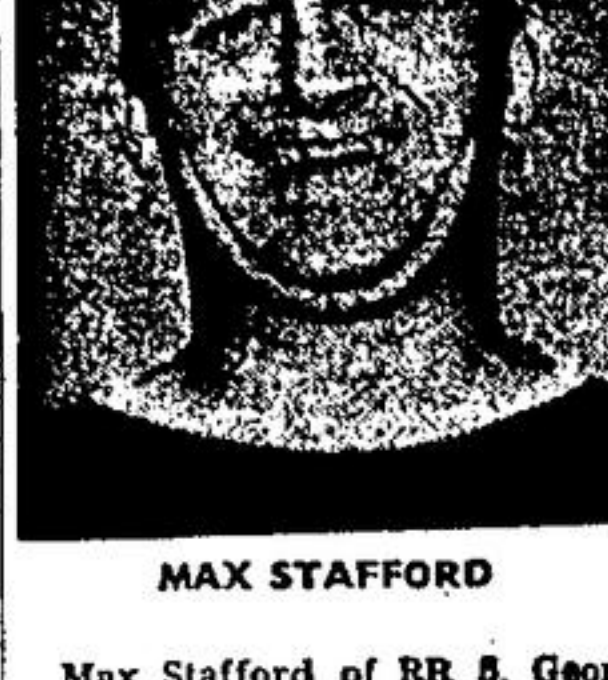
