## Halton Predominates in Testing Dairy Herds

The percentage of dairy cattle tested for milk production has been receiving considerable attention during the past few months. Throughout Ontario, only 8% of the dairy herds are on the test — ROP, or Record of Performance for the pure bred herds, and DHIA or Dairy Herd Improvement Associations for the grades.

Halton County dairymen can be proud of the fact that 52% of our producers are enrolled on a testing programme. There are

108 on ROP and 60 on DHIA for a total of 168 out of 315.

In this total of 315 dairy farms, 50 are shipping cream. Only 3 of these farms are testing their herds. Thus, if we think only of the fluid and manufacturing milk shippers, with 160 out of the 265 on test, this gives Halton a 60% level. Certainly this is something of which we can be quite proud. However, we must continue until every herd is on test.

These records, ROP and DHIA serve two purposes. They take the guesswork out of selecting the best cows in the herd, and

they can also be used to select the bulls for your herd improvement. They provide excellent tools for selection and culling. Anyone interested in enrolling should contact the agricultural office.

## Alberta Elk En Route To Join Buffalo Herd

Four new arrivals to the Rattlesnake Point area are scheduled to arrive this week—a group of elk from Alberta.

The elk will be placed in a 75 acre game preserve that already contains four buffalo. The game preserve is just west of the cliff face that borders the picnic and recreation area on the top of Rattlesnake Point.

The elk are being brought by train from a preserve in Alberta — where they were rounded up in September, so the herds could be counted. The animals had to be kept in quarantine for several weeks to determine if they were healthy.

The Halton Region Conservation Authority made the arrangements to bring the elk here, and the animals were put on the train in the west on Friday.

During the summer, the Conservation Authority considered several types of animals that could be brought into the area — including musk oxen and lynx. The buffalo, which have been here for a year now have attracted many visitors anxious to take pictures — and the buffalo have proved very cooperative, staying near the fence, where a small stream runs along beside Walker's Line, the only access to the valley in which the game preserve is located.

The valley has long been noted for the amount of birds and animals found there — including deer, rabbits, groundhogs, several species of hawks and turkey vultures.
