Roger Carey, 26, a native of Windsor and a former Georgetown resident, has been reported washed overboard and lost at sea 300 miles off the coast of Spain.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Carey, now living in Brampton, were notified that Roger, serving as second mate aboard a charter sailing vessel, was washed overboard during a storm. The mishap occurred November 1st. The Careys were notified by telegrams signed by the ship's captain and the British Embassy.

Milton Ekes Close Victory Beats Raiders on Home Ice

Milton Merchants survived Georgetown Raider show of power in the third period to escape with 6-5 victory in an OHA Suburban Junior C game in Georgetown Memorial Arena Sunday.

Milton pumped in four second period goals and then hung on as Georgetown dominated the closing period and came within a whisker of erasing the difference.

The teams were deadlocked at a goal piece after one period, but Milton took a 5-2 lead into the third. They stretched it to 6-2 and then watched it shrink as Raider snipers zeroed in.

In four meetings to date each club has won two. Raiders have scored on Merchants 20 times, Milton against Georgetown 16 times.

Graham Hern sparked the Milton win with a pair of goals while Steve Gervais, Kevin Hall, Paul Kitchen and Jim Chalkley netted one each.

Paul Robinson counted two of the Raider goals while Phil Lawell, Ron Lane, and Bill Dwyer got the others.

The game wasn't as rough as the Friday night clash in Milton which Georgetown won 5-0 but Paul Robinson and Milton's Steve Lawrence drew majors for a first period scuffle which started when Lawrence pushed at the Raider forward after play had stopped.

Georgetown's Phil Lavell opened the scoring at 7:37 when his deflected shot from 20 feet out fooled Bob Lee. Milton was trying to untangle its power play when Ron Lane fed Lavell the set up pass.

Steve Gervais from Cole and Hearn's evened the count with a little over a minute left.

Merchants cracked the game wide open in the middle period when Hern scored two goals and Hall one. Chalkley, Hearn, Stickle and Tuckwell were credited with the assists.

Ron Lane's unassisted goal at 14:18 put Georgetown back on Merchant's heels but Kitchen, a Milton juvenile brought up for the game, scored seconds later to restore the visitors' three goal cushion.

Chalkley bumped Milton into a comfortable 6-2 lead with his goal from Lawrence and Rick Cole early in the third period.

THE BARBERING INDUSTRY GEORGETOWN ZONE

WHEREAS the Minister of Labour has designated that part of Ontario described in Ontario Regulation 334/67 as the GEORGETOWN ZONE and as a zone for the BARBERING INDUSTRY which he has defined as all work done by barbers in,

- (a) shaving or trimming a beard or moustache;
- (b) cutting, trimming, singeing, shampooing or dressing hair;
- (c) giving: — (i) facial massage, or (ii) scalp treatment;
- and (d) honing or stropping a razor, except where performed in barber schools, licensed under The Apprenticeship and Tradesman's Qualification Act, 1964 and, has received a petition requesting a conference of the employers and employees in the said industry and has authorized the convening of such conference.

NOW THEREFORE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to The Industrial Standards Act, R.S.O. 1960, Chapter 186 as amended, a conference of the employers and employees engaged in the said industry within the said zone is hereby summoned to meet at the Odd Fellows' Hall, Wesleyan Street, Georgetown, Ontario, on Thursday, December 14th, 1967, at the hour of 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of investigating and considering the conditions of labour and the practices prevailing in the said industry and for negotiating and submitting to the Minister of Labour a schedule of wages and hours and days of labour;

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the employers and employees who attend such conference are authorized and empowered by the Industrial Standards Act to negotiate a schedule and, upon the approval and recommendation of the Minister of Labour, The Lieutenant Governor in Council may declare that such schedule shall be binding upon all employers and employees in such industry which includes all persons, in any way engaged or employed in the work or operations included in such industry:
