A grass fire in November? Georgetown firefighters were summoned to douse one on Sunday in a field behind Georgetown Market.

Fire Chief Erwin Lewis said the grass was touched off by someone deliberately setting fire to some papers in a ditch. The papers had been ignited by a match or cigarette butt.

It was the second of two fire calls Sunday. Earlier, firemen doused flames inside a partially completed development house on Fleming Court.

Ground floor ceiling and part of the subflooring in an upstairs room was damaged.

A neighbour, who noticed smoke billowing from the house, turned in the alarm.

Chief Lewis said children had been playing in the house shortly before the fire was discovered. He said damage would run about \$350.

Teaching Like Popping Corn Teachers Told

David Parsons, sales manager for Science Research Associates told Halton County teachers at a meeting of the International Reading Association in Burlington last week that teaching is like putting corn in a corn popper.

"Heat is applied universally," he said, "but each kernel 'pops' individually."

The SRA reading skills program allows each child to learn on his own, the speaker said, correcting his own test papers and even grading himself.

Lorne Skuce, former Halton county inspector of public schools, presented pins to eleven International Reading Association past presidents including two from Georgetown, Howard Wrigglesworth School principal William Kinrade and teacher Mrs. William Cromar.

Three hundred Halton teachers attended the lectures.
