

# Grand Jury Demands Quick Action on Halton Jail Facilities

Halton's County Jail — more than 100 years old and scheduled for replacement by a modern regional institute at Hornby — came under fire last week from the grand jury.

The grand jury, making its quarterly report on county buildings, told Judge Alan Sprague last week that the county jail was "cramped, badly lit, suffering from crude sanitation, and inadequately served for libraries and recreation."

The grand jury urged the construction of a new jail as soon as possible.

The \$2 million Halton - Peel jail project is still on the drawing board. A recent announcement by Allan Grossman, minister of reform institutions has let county officials off the hook for payment of the new jail's construction and maintenance costs.

The new jail for Halton-Peel will be called Maplehurst and will be built on the Ninth Line north of Highway 401 just east of Hornby.

## Not Adequate

In urging early construction of the new regional jail, the grand jury declared that the present jail is not adequate for prisoners detained any length of time. It suggested that longer term prisoners and those awaiting decision on appeals should be placed elsewhere.

It suggested that prisoners should stay no longer than 60 days.

Getting the new jail off the ground has caused much friction between Halton and Peel counties. One councillor has called it the "regional dissension centre."

Main argument was who is going to pay what but this was settled with the announcement that the provincial government would take over the costs.

Judge Alan Sprague thanked the grand jury for its report which will be considered by Halton County Council.

## Candles and Goblets Upside Down

Goblets become candleholders when they are turned upside down. Stand them in a row on a window sill. Let them light the living room. March them down the middle of the smorgasbord table. They are bright and effective and very quick and easy to arrange. Inside each goblet, place a large Christmas ball, each one a different color. Secure 10 inch red candles to the bottoms of the goblets (which are now the tops) with candle wax or floral clay, hide it with sprigs of evergreen. If you use candlewax, decorate or not as you wish — the wax matches the candle and does not show.

# Holiday Fruitcake



1 1/2 cups (3/4 pound) chopped candied cherries — 1 cup (1/2 pound) chopped candied pineapple — 1/2 cup (1/4 pound) Chopped candied citron — one half cup (1/4 pound) chopped candied lemon peel — 1/2 cup (1/4 pound) chopped candied orange peel — 1 cup light raisins — 1 cup chopped walnuts — 3 cups sifted all-purpose flour — 1 cup butter or margarine — 1 cup sugar — 4 eggs — 1/4 cup light corn syrup — 1/4 cup orange juice — 1/4 cup sherry

Combine fruits and nuts; coat well with 1 cup of the flour. Cream butter or margarine and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beat in well after each. Combine corn syrup, orange juice and sherry; add alternately with remaining flour to creamed mixture. Fold in fruits and nuts. Pour batter into well-greased baking pans of desired shapes. For 5-12 cup ring molds, bake 75 to 85 minutes at 275 degrees. For 4 1/2 x 2 1/2 inch pans bake 60 or 70 minutes at 275 degrees.
