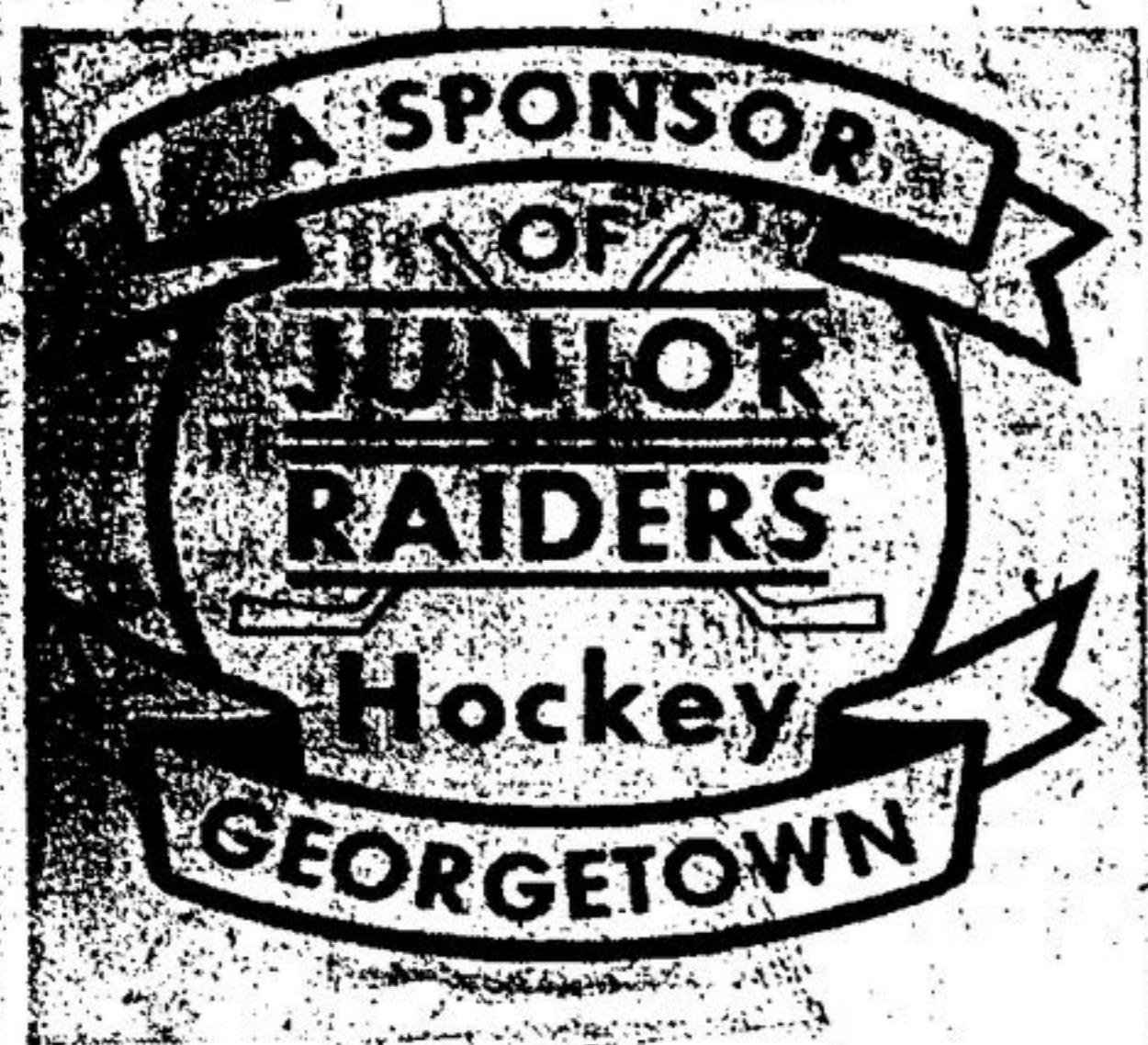


Decal Doubly Designed for Hockey Funds, Support

Raiders Slipping Lose Three of Four Lindsay Alone on Top

A long looping shot by Lindsay's Dave Byrnes that threaded the top left corner of the Georgetown Raider net in a Suburban Junior C League game here Sunday enabled Lindsay to complete a two-game sweep.

Byrnes' goal at 14:12 of the third period was the difference as the league leaders edged Raiders 3-2 in Lindsay Friday. Georgetown took a 4-1 setback.

Sunday's loss was the 3rd in four for Raiders who slipped to third place behind Lindsay and Milton Merchants.

Raiders again gave their opposition a lead and then fell just short in their comeback try.

Double penalties and the lightning fast hands of Lindsay goalie Pat Davidson killed Raiders. Paul and Kent Robinson were off when Larry Locke gave Lindsay the lead at 3:17, and Jack Kemshead and Phil Lavell were in the cooler when Gord Coombs made it 2-0 at 8:57 of the second period.

Paul Robinson steered Dave McMenemy's shot into the net to put Raiders back in the game at 2:29 of the third period, but Byrnes' goal two minutes later took a lot of the steam out of the rally.

Terry Hay scored Georgetown's second goal with five minutes left but that was the end of the line. Raider snipers came within a fraction of a deadlock but Davidson's combination of quick reflexes and lady luck was too much.

In Lindsay on Friday Raiders potent scoring punch was smothered until less than 3 minutes remained. Ron Lane scored unassisted to spoil the shutout.

Neither team broke the bubble until well into the middle period, and then Lindsay rocked Georgetown with two quick goals. Jim Grills found the target at 4:25 and Ron Williams piled on number two just 20 seconds later. Both goals were unassisted. Lindsay took a 3-0 lead to their dressing room.

Bliss Novices Come Back-Earn Tie With Burlington

Georgetown Bliss Eagles came back to tie Burlington in the third period Sunday after being down 3-0. Burlington scored twice in the first period, both goals off the stick of Lance Nethery assisted by Murray and Hawk.
