

Leslie, Lindsay Recipients Of Canada Centennial Medals

Retiring reeve George Leslie and clerk K. C. Lindsay, of the Township of Lesbury, are receiving the two Canadian Centennial medals, awarded in the township.

Upon receiving a letter from Mrs. McIntyre, secretary of the cabinet, at the final council meeting of the year, on Friday, asking the council to send in two names as their choice for the medals council decided to have Leslie and Lindsay.

Lindsay, in recognition of his long years of service to the township, should be the other.
