10 Commandments Snowmobile Safety

- (1) Driving instruction is required for the safe operation of a snowmobile.
- (2) Treat a snowmobile with the respect and care due any power-driven vehicle, and recognize the limitations of your ability to operate it.
- (3) Study carefully the operating manual supplied by the manufacturer of the snowmobile you are using.
- (4) Know your legal status regarding licensing, traffic regulations and responsibilities pertaining to public liability and property damage when operating for trailing a snowmobile.
- (5) Avoid public thoroughfares and when necessary cross at right angles using extreme caution.
- (6) Do not operate a snowmobile on frozen lakes or rivers without first checking ice thickness and having an intimate knowledge of water currents.
- (7) Wear appropriate, warm, windproof clothing, insulated footwear and mitts, torque with attached face mask, shatterproof, tinted goggles and safety helmet.
- (8) For casual snowmobiling within reach of assistance, carry spare drive-belt and spark plugs with tools for installation.
- (9) For distant safari operation carry the following equipment: snowshoes, emergency fuel, map and compass, axe, knife, waterproofed patches, mess kit, emergency rations, first aid kit, water-proof shelter and survival blanket.
- (10) Do not attempt distant safaris without an experienced person in charge; and use the "buddy system," two snowmobiles or more.

Offer Fine Ski Facilities This Season at Glen Eden

The public got its first look Friday at what Halton conservation officials claim is the best ski area south of Collingwood and Muskoka.

Friday's open house at the spruced-up Glen Eden Ski Club gave area skiers a chance to inspect the re-engineered lengthened slopes, new chalet, with fireplace, picture windows and snack bar and indoor toilets and the new snowmaking equipment.

The club, which slid into bankruptcy after five years of private operation, is now administered by the Halton Region Conservation Authority. The Authority leased the land in the Kelso Conservation Area to the original owners and installed a bar two years ago to keep the club from going under.

Since taking over last December, the Authority has spent more than \$10,000 regrading the slopes for safer skiing, moving and enlarging the chalet, and building a new pond and piping system for more efficient snowmaking. They now expect to lay six inches of snow per day on the main face.

"And as a further step in turning Glen Eden into a top rate family ski area," Authority chairman Barry Humphreys said at yesterday's opening, "we have contacted the Oakville and Burlington recreation committees about lessons for south Halton children."
