"We have been working with other societies for quite a while, usually those from nearby centres like Toronto and Hamilton," he said: "but we sent the prospective parents to them rather than have them send the babies here."

"But this is an emergency situation that has been building up in London for some time, and it finally got to the point where they had babies still in the maternity hospitals with no place to send them.

And so when he got the call for help from London, he decided to cut through the red tape, take the children and treat them as Halton County

It's a lot more work for our staff," he said. "But by gosh we're willing to do it if we can: get them placed."




