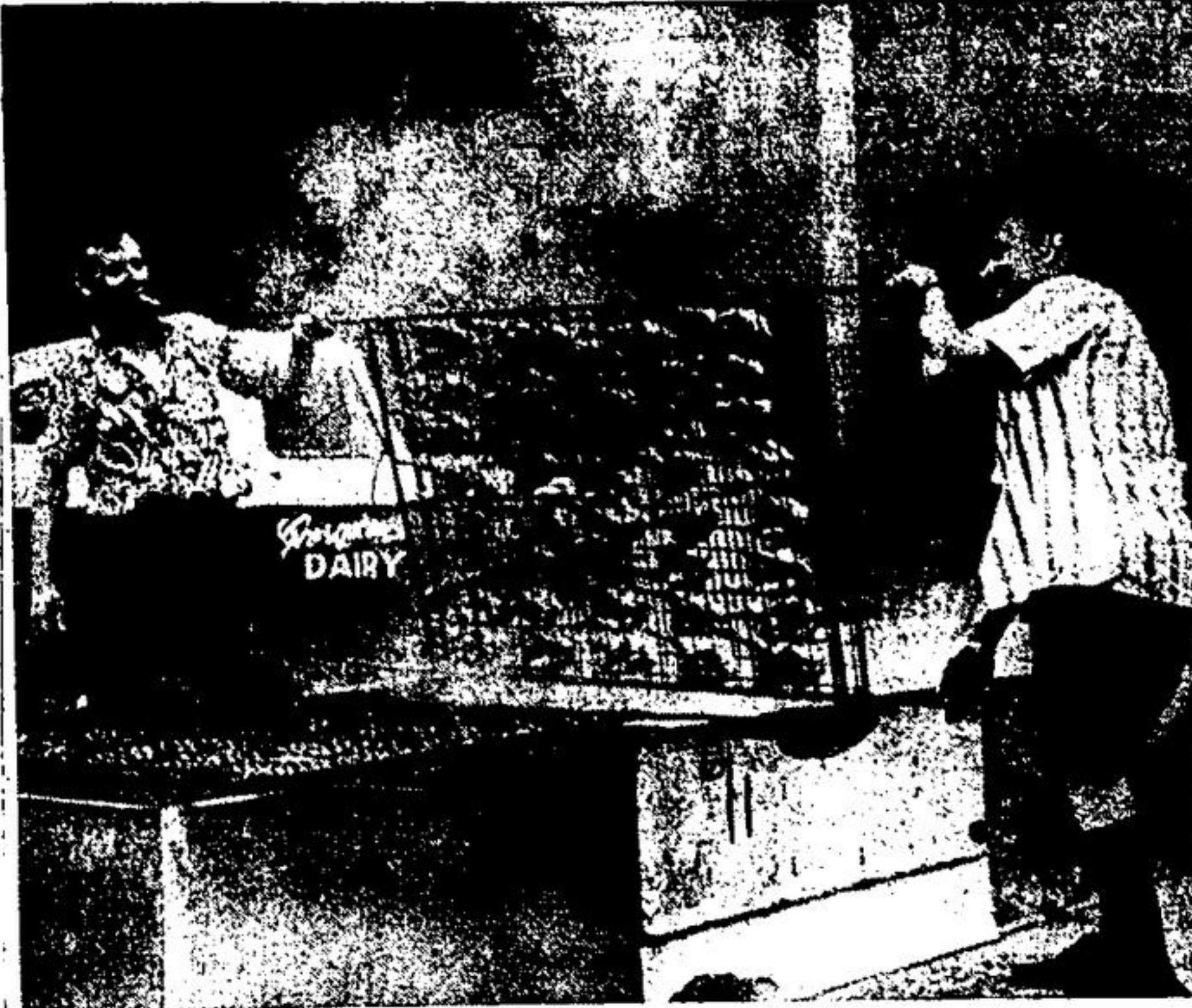


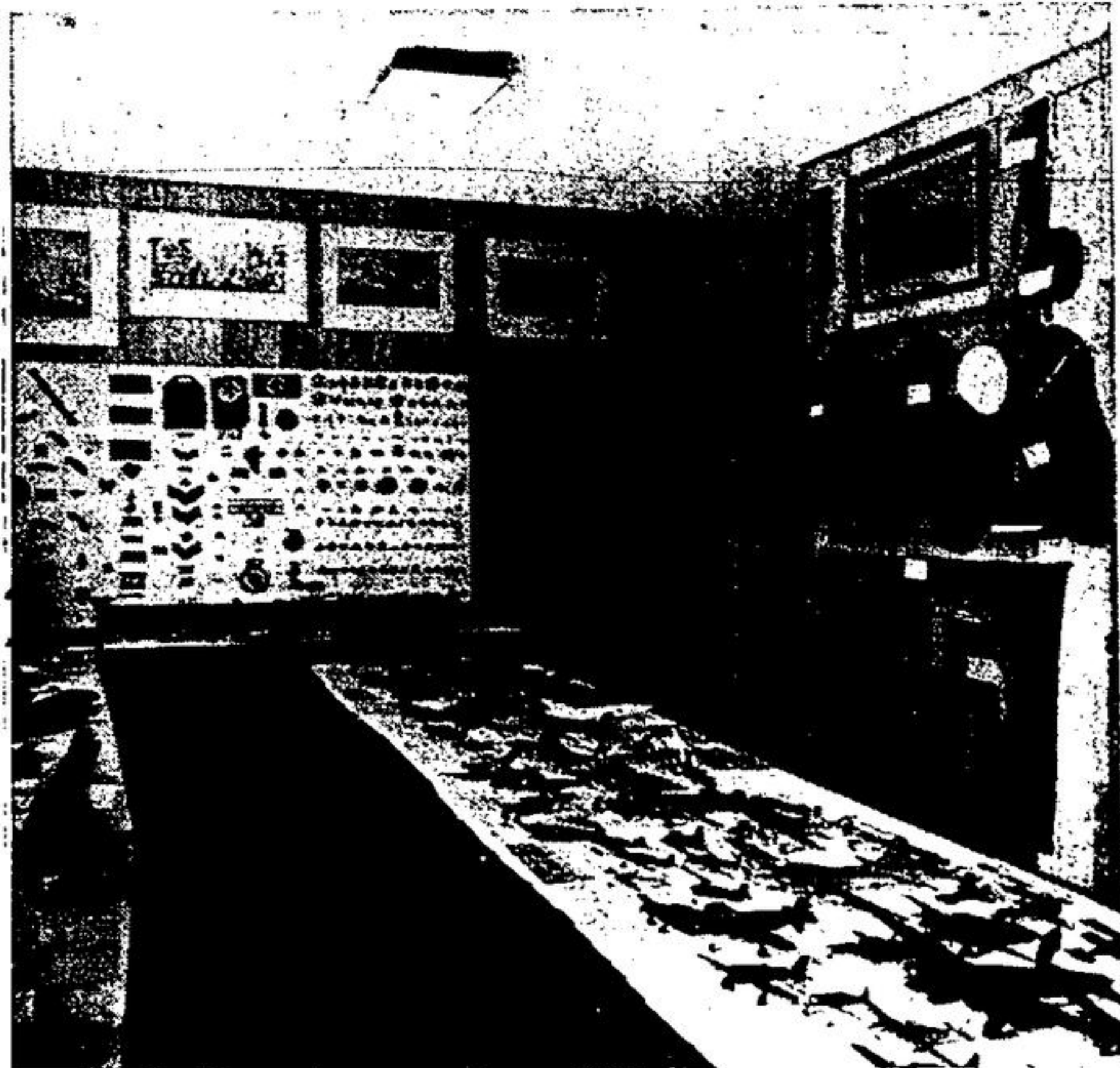
This Was Centennial Year—Norval Salutes Confed'n

Announce 1968 Construction Start on Maplehurst Complex

Reforms Institutions Minister Allan Grossman yesterday announced a \$7 million construction program, the first leg of which will be Maplehurst, a regional detention centre to replace the antiquated Halton and Peel county jails.

Most of the construction will be done on Maplehurst, in three stages.

Start of '68

Grossman said in a press conference that construction there will start in 1968 and be completed in three or four years.

The first phase will be a reformatory, followed by a medium security training centre and finally by Maplehurst regional detention centre, all on the same site.

There is a possibility that the site for Maplehurst in North Oakville near Hornby, chosen by county authorities, might be changed. The original plan was for a regional detention centre, but a training centre and reformatory have been added.

Each of the three facilities will handle about 200 inmates and the staff to handle them will total about 200. The training centre will provide academic and vocational facilities for male offenders between 16 and 25.

Under the Criminal Code regulations, offenders who draw less than a two year sentence are treated by provincial authorities. Anything more is a federal offence.

Maplehurst will handle short-term repeaters in its reformatory and provide semi-skilled work and training.

Reforms Institutions information officer Don Kerr said this week "the new training centre will fill a great need within the department by providing a program for young offenders who have the potential to benefit from academic and vocational training, but who require a perimeter security setting."

Unique Plan

Kerr said this portion of the complex will be unique in the province.

The existing Brampton Training Centre is similar in function but is an "open" setting and

doesn't provide the necessary security for treating some young offenders who could benefit from its concepts.

Maplehurst's reformatory will replace the one at Mimico and two forestry camps, one near Guelph and the other near Barrie, will be attached to it.

Until the regional detention centre, the last phase of construction slated for Maplehurst is completed, prisoners awaiting

ing sentence will still be held in the old Halton and Peel jails.

"We have no choice in the matter," Kerr said this morning.

When completed, Maplehurst is expected to reduce the population at Toronto's trouble-ridden Don Jail from 700 to 200.

The construction of a reformatory at the Maplehurst site will be first on the list in order for inmates at Mimico to be transferred. This will enable authorities to make use of the Mimico facilities for the treatment of drug addicts, alcoholics and sex deviates.
