Centennial year for Canada has developed into a banner year for the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, too. Several major projects planned over the years now are under construction and everyone is now looking forward to the second ten years of Authority work with high hopes.

Until this year the Credit Valley Conservation Authority had only a list of about 18 of these ponds which, if cleaned of silt, could provide water storage areas. During 1967 engineering was completed and dredging started on the first of these ponds; Fairy Lake at Acton. If the dredging at Acton proves economically feasible then other ponds at Caledon (five) Alton, (two) Hillsburgh, (two) Mono, Erin, Limehouse, Georgetown, Meadowvale, Norval, Stewartville and Huttonville will receive more careful examination. Each project will be judged according to its individual merits, i.e., how large a storage capacity could be formed, condition of the dam and overall cost.

**HARLEY TO HALTON**



Weekly Observations by Dr. Harry Harley, M.P. for Halton

THE GOVERNMENT has announced in the House of Commons that Veterans pensions and allowances will be increased by 16 per cent as of 1st January 1968. This has been a long-awaited decision and completes the Government's actions at this time after the interim increases granted sometime ago.

THE BILL abolishing capital punishment has passed the Senate and is not expected to be completed until sometime in the New Year.

THE MATTER OF the Bill on divorce is now before the Senate and is not expected to be completed until sometime in the New Year.

THE HOUSE OF Commons is proceeding with the Broadcasting Act and it is not likely to be sent to the Senate until sometime in January 1968.

THE MINISTER of Justice has introduced in the House of Commons an Omnibus Bill dealing with the Criminal Code which will cover many matters such as breathalyzer tests; abortion; lotteries; and firearms. This is a very long Bill, 73 pages in length, and has become a public document at this time in order that its many different clauses and provisions may be studied for at least a month before the Government proceeds with them in the House of Commons.

THE HOUSE of Commons recesses this week and will re-assemble in Ottawa to continue the present Session on 22nd January, 1968.
