





THEY FOUND HOMES

THESE FOUR BABIES who arrived at Halton County Children's Aid-late in the year, and five who arrived a week earlier, are all in new homes for the start of 1968. They were all sent here by the Western Ontano Children's Aid in London because of an emergency situation there. Dr. Gordon Askwith, in charge of the Halton society said: "this situation has been building up in London for some time and it finally got to the 'point where they have babies still in the maternity hospitals. With no place to send them." The Halton County society has a 59 per cent permanent adoption record - highest in the prov-Ince last year. Dr. Askwith attributed the local group's good record to many factors, including the quality of his starf and the area in which they operate. "We live in an area with many couples adopting babies, probably because we are by and large a suburb of Metro and Hamilton and because Halton has Canada's highest per capita income," he said.
