# REMINDE MOTORISTS THAT WINDOWS MUST BE CLEAR

During the week of December 24 to December 30, 1967, inclusive, personnel of North Halton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police, worked a total of 730 1/2 hours and patrolled 5158 miles on area highways. As a result of patrol 15 charges were preferred, 20 traffic warnings were issued, and 13 vehicles were safely checked.

There were 7 property damage accidents, 3 personal injury accidents resulting in 4 persons being injured, and 1 fatal accident resulting in 2 persons being killed. Property damage totalled \$8000. Causes of accidents were: Sped too fast for road or traffic conditions, inattentive driving, improper turns.

As a result of these accidents, four charges were laid:

There were 27 general occurrences reported during this period, including 1 Break and Enter, 2 premises found insecure, 2 disturbances complaints, 3 LCA infractions, 2 stolen cars recovered, one person admitted to the mental hospital and one suicide.

Effective October 1st, 1967 the following Section came in effect in Ontario under the provisions of The Highway Traffic Act:

"Sec. 41b: (1) No person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a highway,

(a) unless the windshield and the windows on either side of the compartment containing the steering wheel are in such a condition as to afford the driver a clear view to the front and side of the motor vehicle; and

(b) unless the rear window is in such a condition as to afford the driver a clear view to the rear of the motor vehicle.

(2) Clause 1 of subsection 1 does not apply to a motor vehicle that is equipped with a mirror or mirrors securely attached to the motor vehicle and placed in such a position as to afford the driver a view through the rear window, a clearly-reflective view of the roadway in the rear of any vehicle approaching from the rear.
