Three Raiders Boost Scoring Averages

A herd of bulldozers couldn't have done a more efficient job of levelling the Richmond Hill than that executed by a single Georgetown Raider forward line Thursday night.

Terry Leswick, Ron Lane and Paul Robinson took the OHA Suburban Junior C game as a personal challenge, and amassed 24 points between them on the night while leading Georgetown to a 12-1 victory. Leswick fired five goals and assisted on three, Robinson notched three with six assists, and Lane triggered two and set up five.

The only other Raiders to figure in the Richmond assault statistics were Larry Bradley and Brad Johnson who counted the other goals, and Bob Lammann, Jack Kenishead, Dave McMenomy and John Quackenbush, who assisted.

The only puck to get behind Raider goalie Brian Peavoy was put there with 14 secs. left in the first period. Greg Bodnar scored it from Armstrong.

Despite the strong showing Raiders were actually operating with a minimum crew, missing Bill Dwyer, Terry Hay, Wayne McMullen, Dave Sheppard and Kent Robinson.

Sixty shots were rained on the Hill hut, while Peavoy looked at 34.

Raiders hit Richmond Hill with five goals in a four minute span in the first period when they built a 6-1 cushion, and then added three in each remaining period.

TV Camera Recorded Hole-in-One Shot

Golf buffs who have never witnessed a hole-in-one, an experience almost as pure as sinking one, will be able to do so Sunday, January 21st, when the rare shot in golf, turns up in the first match featured on Shell's Wonderful World of Golf Television Series on Channel 6.

The ace, the first in seven years of the show, was made by Spanish professional Sebastian Miguel and it earned him a \$10,000 bonus award. Miguel made the classic shot on the 205 yard par three, sixth hole at the Real Club de Golf 'El Prat' near Barcelona, Spain.

While experts place the odds of a golfer making a hole-in-one at something like 24,000-to-one, it would be impossible to over-estimate the astronomical odds of one being recorded from tee-to-cup by a television camera.

Blades Never Recover From Two First Minute Goals in Sunday Tilt

Anybody who watched Georgetown host Oakville Blades in Georgetown Memorial arena Sunday afternoon would have to say these two are not very likely to exchange Valentino cars come February 14.

Officials caught the combatants for 42 infractions most violent of which was a second period stick swinging duel between Raider's Ron Lane and Oakville's Ferro.

In between the minor scuffles the team played enough hockey to fashion a 7-2 decision in Raider's favour.

The stick fight produced the game's heaviest penalties. Lane was tagged with a five minute major, Ferro a match misconduct and Terry Leswick a game misconduct. Leswick altered the time because he was, as the OHA rule book puts it, third man in an altercation.

Leswick came to Lane's aid when Ferro continued to flail with the lumber after the Raider player had dropped his weapon and gloves.

Raiders spoiled Oakville's plan to upset the league leaders while customers were still filling in. Tardy spectators waiting for the opening whistle before wandering in from the lobby got to a seat in time to read 2-0 on the scoreboard.

The Ron Lane, Paul Robinson Terry Leswick line, which devastated Richmond Hill a couple of nights earlier took up where they left off and fired goals at 17 seconds and 37 seconds.

Leswick broke the ice with the first goal from Robinson and Lane, and Lane struck 20 seconds later from his line mates.

Georgetown went on to construct a 5-0 lead before the period was over. Terry Hay scored from Leswick at 13:10; Ron Lane from Hay and Phil Lavell at 14:46 and Leswick again from Robinson and Lavell at 16:57.

Raiders outscored the visitors 2-1 in the middle period. Robinson widened it to 6-0 from Bill Dwyer and Phil Lavell, and Brad Johnson scored Raiders' seventh from Hay at 9:22. In between them Oakville hit the scoresheet on Gord Armstrong's goal from Gibson.

Blades had the only scoring play of the final period. Lawrence notched it from Hunting with 32 seconds left on the clock.

Raiders and Blades continue their feud in the post town Friday night and meet again this Sunday on Raider ice.
