into the Festival finals in Sarina.

Two young players, Allison Macintosh, and Michael Macdonald, will make their debut in central roles of the play. With them are Vera Macdonald as the governess, Betty Fisher as the housekeeper, and Eric Ming and Lynn Wiggins in 'ghostly roles'.

This play is an adaptation of "The

Turn of the Screw" by Henry James.

Lighting, music and effects contribute largely to the atmosphere of this eerie play.

Adjudicator Leslie Yeo has been actor, manager, director, in both stage and TV for many years. He most recently starred at the Shaw Festival at Niagara-

on-the-Lake with Kate Reid in "The Circle." He has been Governor of the Dominion Drama Festival, and a member of the Board of the Canadian Opera Company.
