## Richmond Retiring as Baseball League Prexy

Georgetown's Mr. Baseball, Bill Richmond, tossed in the towel as president of the Halton County Baseball Association at the annual meeting in Burlington on the weekend.

Richmond has headed the County group for two years. He has also served as vice president for two years and was Minor Division Chairman for four years. He will remain on this executive as past president.

The meeting was held in the Royal Canadian Legion in Burlington and as well as electing a new executive the Association worked on necessary preparations for the upcoming season.

Eight of the nine teams were represented with Waterdown Tigers the only club not having a representative.

Alex Stanley was on hand to request permission for Toronto to join the league and the new entry was heartily welcomed as Alex, who had wanted into the league, withdrew their request before a decision could be made.

The Toronto club is expected to be one of the top contenders and will extend the league to ten teams.

The original nine are all expected to be back next year.

Teams that will be returning include Burlington, Dundas, Campbellville, Georgetown, Preston, Milton, Waterdown, Hamilton and Oakville.

The league has forwarded two amendments to the Ontario Baseball Association that will be brought up at the OBA annual convention held in Chatham.

Halton County has asked the OBA to use only two types of balls, one for the Midgets and upwards and the other for under midget. Until now, the OBA ruling has midget using a cheaper type of baseball than the higher clubs, but not the same as the Bantam and lower age clubs have been using.

Classification

Also under the present OBA rules towns of over 25,000 are classified as A Major and must compete against cities with more than double the population. The league suggests that the OBA take a good look and consider reclassification of towns over 50,000 to a "double" A Major grouping.

Both these amendments will be heard at the OBA convention in Chatham and will be presented by the league's representatives, who will be chosen by the new executive.

The election of the new executive was left until the end of the meeting, and the league came up with Alf Baynton as president with first vice president Al Burrows, second vice president is Len Andrews and third vice president Ross Dodman along with an 11-man executive body.
