Extend Existing Library Popular Choice of Readers

One hundred and three library members have now registered their views on the proposals for a new library.

The most popular first choice was to extend the existing library, supported by 60 members. 38 voted for a new library with the existing library to be used as a Branch, and one for a library in the next High School addition. Second choices were 27 for the extension of the existing library, 24 for the new library and 4 for the High School addition.

One person registered strong objection to the extension of the library, nine to building a new library and 25 to the library in the High School addition.

NO HELP WITH ESCARPMENT IS DISAPPOINTMENT

One of the "biggest disappointments" of the year for Halton Region Conservation Authority chairman Barry Humphrey has been the province of Ontario's failure to outline any specific proposals for the preservation of the Niagara Escarpment in the north Halton area.

The authority as far back as December '66, presented a brief to the Ontario government calling for "increased aid in the preservation of the Niagara Escarpment." In the early part of last year, the government did announce that it would be a matter of government policy to preserve the entire ridge from Niagara to Tobermory — the tip of the Bruce Peninsula separating Georgian Bay from Lake Huron.

But there has still been no concrete program announced by the province to show how the government will ensure any preservation — although the Halton authority expects that the government will increase grants to area conservation authorities to purchase additional land.

Confesses Stealing TV Sets from Store

A 23 year old man confessed Tuesday to stealing six TV sets from a Georgetown TV store in February of 1967.

Magistrate Kenneth M. Langdon remanded him in custody until February 15 to await a pre-sentence report.

The man also confessed to breaking into Milton high school in 1963, and six break-ins between December 1966 and August 1967 which netted him goods valued at \$8,800.

"He is attempting to make a new life and clean up all past offenses," a detective told Magistrate Langdon.

Town Veterinarian Attends Convention

Dr. and Mrs. Bob Gaskin, attended the 94th Annual Meeting of the Ontario Veterinary Association which was held at the Holiday Inn, Hamilton, Ontario, from January 28 to 31st, 1968.

During the four day meeting over 50 scientific papers were presented. These covered all aspects of veterinary medicine and included small and large animal medicine and surgery, Research, public health, industrial veterinary medicine as well as the regulatory functions of the profession directed by the Health of Animals Branch, Canada Dept. of Agriculture, encompassing meat inspection, and infectious diseases and animal import control.

A new and additional feature this year was the introduction of the "Intimate Seminars" held on Sunday, January 28th. Five full day seminars dealing with small animals medicine and surgery were held and included the following topics — general surgery, cardiology, respiratory physiology, radiology, ophthalmology and dermatology. Each seminar provided an opportunity for 15 veterinarians to participate all day with one of 5 well known and highly qualified veterinarians.

Three one hour seminars dealing with large animal medicine were also held. The seminar topics were: Equine Lameness, Herd Health Programming and Clinical Pathology.

This annual meeting attracts over 500 veterinarians and their wives from Ontario as well as the rest of Canada and the U.S.

Some of the featured guest speakers at this year's meeting included: Dr. W. R. Cockrill, Animal Production and Health Division, Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations, Rome. Dr. Cockrill spoke on "World Protein Hunger and the Veterinarian." Dr. R. R.

"The Federal government has no right to license people to drive on Ontario highways."

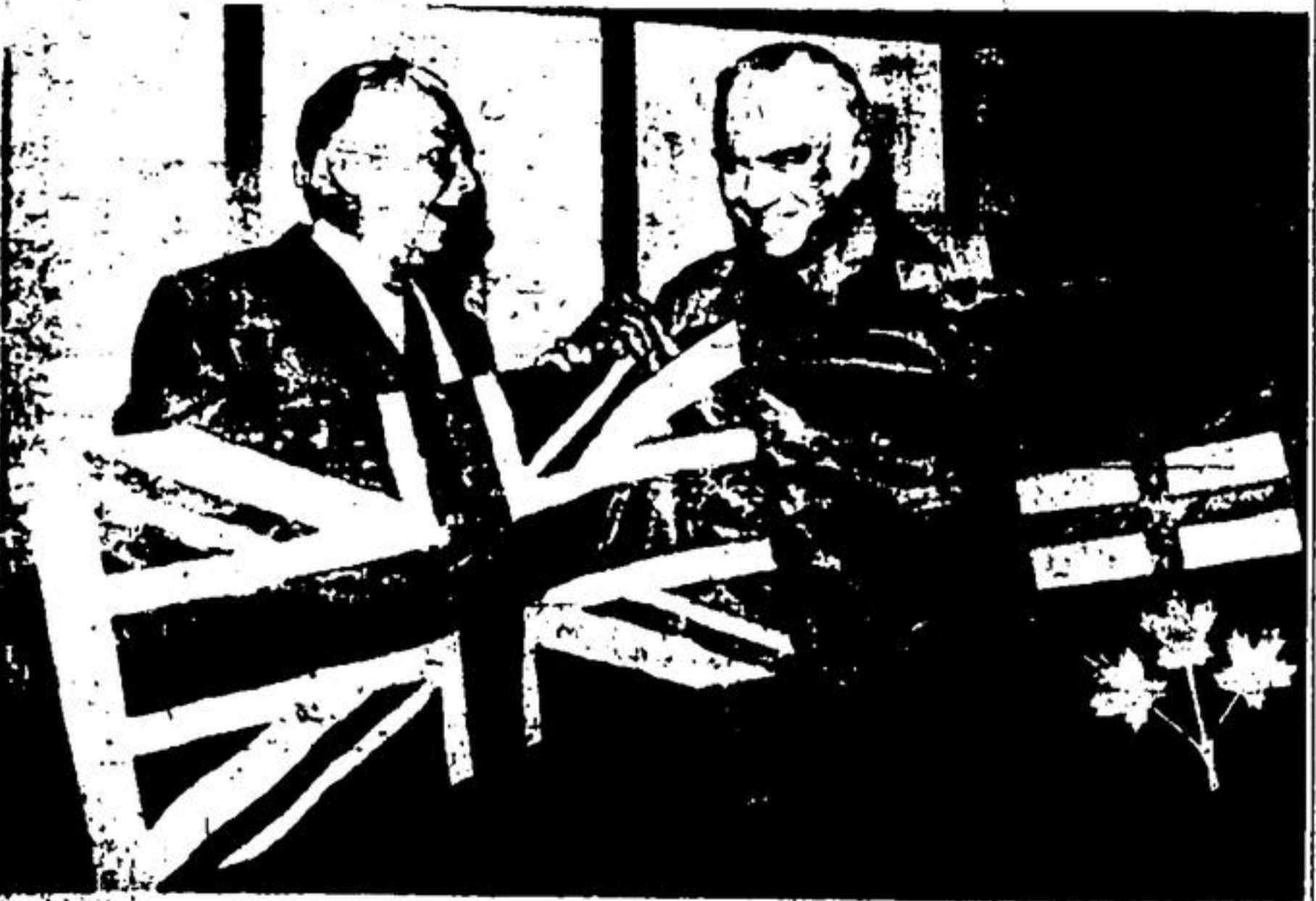
Harley Says Abortion Talks End This Month

Halton's MP Dr. Harry Harley, who is heading the government committee on abortion, said this week that the hearings may go through to the end of the month.

He added: "Whether the committee is ready to submit a final report by this time will depend on whether the committee's attempt to get statistical information from other countries has been successful."

Harley is hoping that the report will be made before Justice Minister Trudeau's attempt to reform the Criminal Code comes up for Commons' discussion.
