The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Don Miller, of North Bay, formerly of Georgetown and the groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George R. Brandford, 15 Mountainview Rd. N.

According to Baha'i law, the marriage was approved by the four parents and then by the local spiritual assembly of the Baha'i of Saltfleet Twp. Arnold Southall, chairman of the assembly, officiated.

The Marriage Tablet was recited by Miss Marlene Miller. The Marriage Oath, "We will all verily abide by the will of God" was said by the bride and groom. A ring was presented, although this is optional in a Baha'i ceremony.

The bride wore a street length gown of gold brocade and carried a bouquet of red roses. The bridesmaid wore a navy blue dress trimmed with white lace and carried a bouquet of pink carnations.

Harry Brandford, the groom's brother, was groomsman. Background music during the ceremony was a recording of the California Baha'i Choir.

Following a buffet lunch Mr. and Mrs. Brandford left on a wedding trip to the United States, visiting Michigan, Indiana and Illinois, including the Baha'i Temple and gardens at Wilmette, Ill.
