WHEREAS Council for the Corporation of the Town of

Georgetown deems it necessary and advisable to amend By-Law No. 5766 which is a By-Law to provide for the use of parking meters in the Town of Georgetown;

AND WHEREAS by Bylaw No. 6677, Section 2 of said. By-Law No. 57:66 was amended in its entirety; AND WHEREAS this By-Law is enacted to further amend said Section 2 of By Law No. 57-66.

LOWS. 1. THAT By Law No. 37 66 be anderted hereby amended by deleting therefrom Section 2 of such by-law in its en-

NOW, THEREFORE, COUNCIL FOR THE CORPORATION

OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN ENACTS AS FOL
