**Form Women's Organization For Halton East Liberals**

An upcoming national election will find the Liberal party with a new feminine task force at its disposal in Halton.

Mrs. R. H. Krempulec, elected president Friday night at the first meeting of the Halton and Halton East Women's Liberal Association, said a major role of the new group will be to boost the party's candidate in the next general election, which might come sooner than we would like.

General aim of the new group which is the first attempt to organize the area's Liberal women, will be to allow members to further their political education, Mrs. Krempulec said.

To this end, she promised to organize reading groups on poli-

tical affairs, a panel discussion with representatives from provincial, national and municipal Liberal women's groups, and an informal meeting with representatives of the various candidates in the present party leadership race.

Assisting at the founding of the new association were Mrs. Robert Nixon, wife of the Ontario Liberal leader, and Mrs. Anne L'Heureux, a vice president of the Toronto and District Liberal Association.

Mrs. L'Heureux acted as special chairman for the election of officers. In addition to Mrs. Krempulec, the group's first executive includes vice presidents Betty Young, Mrs. R. Zuar and Lesley Waller; secretary Mrs. E. Zechman and treasurer Mrs. W. Warends.

**Car Ditched in Fog Baby Fatally Injured**

A single-car accident on a foggy curve on Highway 401 near Milton took the life of nine-month-old Donna Luxton and sent the rest of her family to hospital about 7:35 Saturday morning.

The car driven by the baby's uncle, John Baker, 27, of 151 Siebert Avenue in Kitchener, went out of control through a row of guardrails and crashed into a ditch near a bridge. The car was westbound.

Donald and Joan Luxton, the baby's mother and father, of 1760 Wilson Avenue in Downs-

view, were taken along with Baker and their son Donald, two to Milton Hospital. They were then transferred to Hamilton Ambulance.

Donna's father suffered a broken left leg and arm.

Mrs. Luxton is being treated for head lacerations. Young Donald, who was not admitted to Hamilton General for treatment, received only minor cuts and bruises.

Baker is being treated for head injuries and a broken left leg.

A spokesman for the Ontario Provincial Police, Milton detachment said that the road was wet and fog-bound.

**Halton Conservationists Find More Projects Than Money**

Halton Region Conservation Authority wound up 1967 with a \$43,027 deficit a budget meeting heard last week.

Harry Humphreys, authority chairman said, the Authority had \$78,707-worth of worthwhile projects to deal with in 1968, and \$34,933, with which to carry them out.

The authority approved a capital levy of \$84,812 and allocation of \$49,078, deciding to dole out the remaining \$34,933 on a project priority basis.

A \$1.45 per capita levy on Halton region municipalities will bring in \$211,400 this year. There are almost 10,000 more people in the area than in 1967, the authority was told.

The population increase will bring in roughly an extra \$14,000, and with a considerable expected increase in revenue the authority hopes to cut the overall deficit down to around \$7,000.

Big money-raising and improvement plans are afoot for the Keesee Conservation area. The authority is planning for the construction of a pavilion, including washrooms, change-rooms, and a concession booth. Early estimates are at \$32,000, but it will probably cost less.

Last week's meeting approved a \$135,800 administration budget for the year — \$15,250 more than last year. Main reason for the administration hike is an \$11,000 increase in wages.

The total of \$145,600 was approved for conservation services during 1968, of which \$72,800 will come from the municipal levy. The total figure is almost \$19,000 more than last year's expenditure.
