Georgetown Midgets won their third straight game over Trenton Midget Club on Friday night here in Georgetown Arena with a 3-1 victory. Arena Will Have New Look After Lobby And Entrance Project

The Georgetown Board of Parks Management, the body that handles the affairs of Georgetown, Memorial Arena, have invited tenders for an ambitious project that will give the building a new lobby and new entrance. They're hopeful the reconstruction will start in early May.

Involved is knocking out the east lobby wall to increase the area, new fibre floor, new ceiling and walls. The lobby will be relocated and modernized, occupying the entire front side with a straight counter, instead of its present corner.

When work is completed there will also be two sets of double doors leading from the lobby to the rink area. Instead of one set of double doors and a single door as at present.

New doors at the John Street entrance will be recessed into the building, and customers will be using new exterior steps. Two flights of steps facing east and west will rise from street level.

New steel doors with panic bar openers will be installed on all exits.

In process now is a new entrance from the parking lot at the rear of the building. This double door entrance will have a ticket booth so customers can enter directly from the lot.

Board members are no doubt hoping the public will take better care of the new facilities than they did of renovations done last fall.

Approximately \$100,000 work will have to be done to the ladies' washroom which was rebuilt last year at a cost of \$1200. Some "ladies" have shown their appreciation for the new facilities by decorating the walls with purple poetry, and a hole has been knocked in one of the walls.

A board member said the men's washrooms look like those of a palace in comparison.

From this point on Trenton really began to press but in their eagerness were also picking up a number of senseless penalties nullifying any advantages they might have gained.

Time and again the Georgetown town defencemen and forwards swooped down in time to clear the puck away from in front of their own net. Georgetown were under tremendous pressure during the second half of this period as Ray Inglis picked up a 5 minute major at 12:38 and then Neil Korzack got a 2 minute penalty at 14:50 and Georgetown played two men short.

Persistent and aggressive checking disrupted Trenton who became completely frustrated. The life was drained out of the Trenton team as Ferguson picked up two penalties one after the other in the late stage of the game.

In this game Ferguson who was Trenton's Cinderella Man all winter was contained by Georgetown to the extent that this was his first game all winter not to have kept up his three goal average per game. In his frustration he picked up several penalties. One Trenton player picked up a match penalty as a result of shoving one of the officials in the dying minutes of the game.

With a minute and forty seconds left in the game the Trenton coach was so upset that he permitted the whole Trenton bench to go over to the penalty box. The officials called the game and it was a rather shameful ending to an otherwise exciting and hard fought game.
