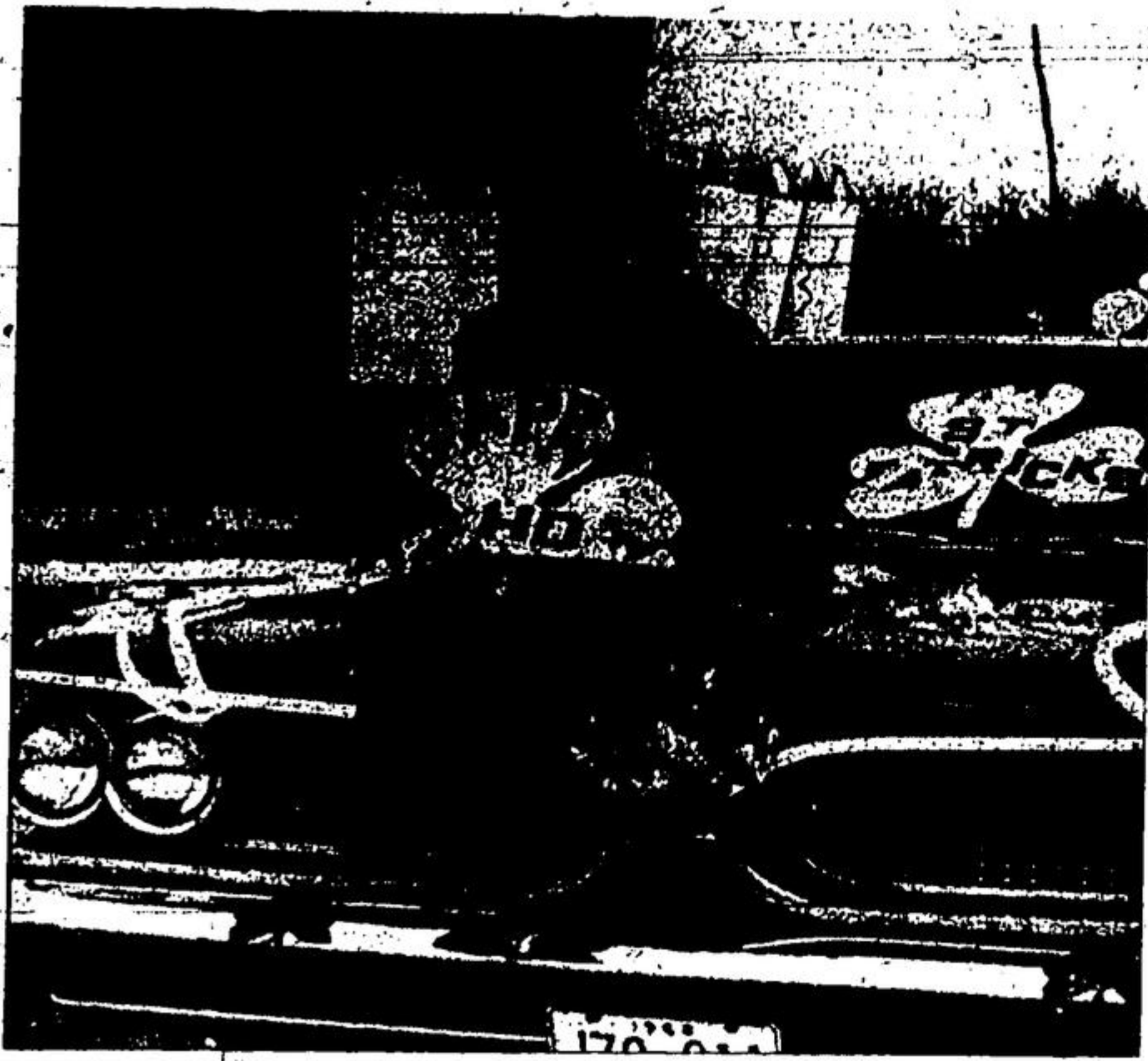
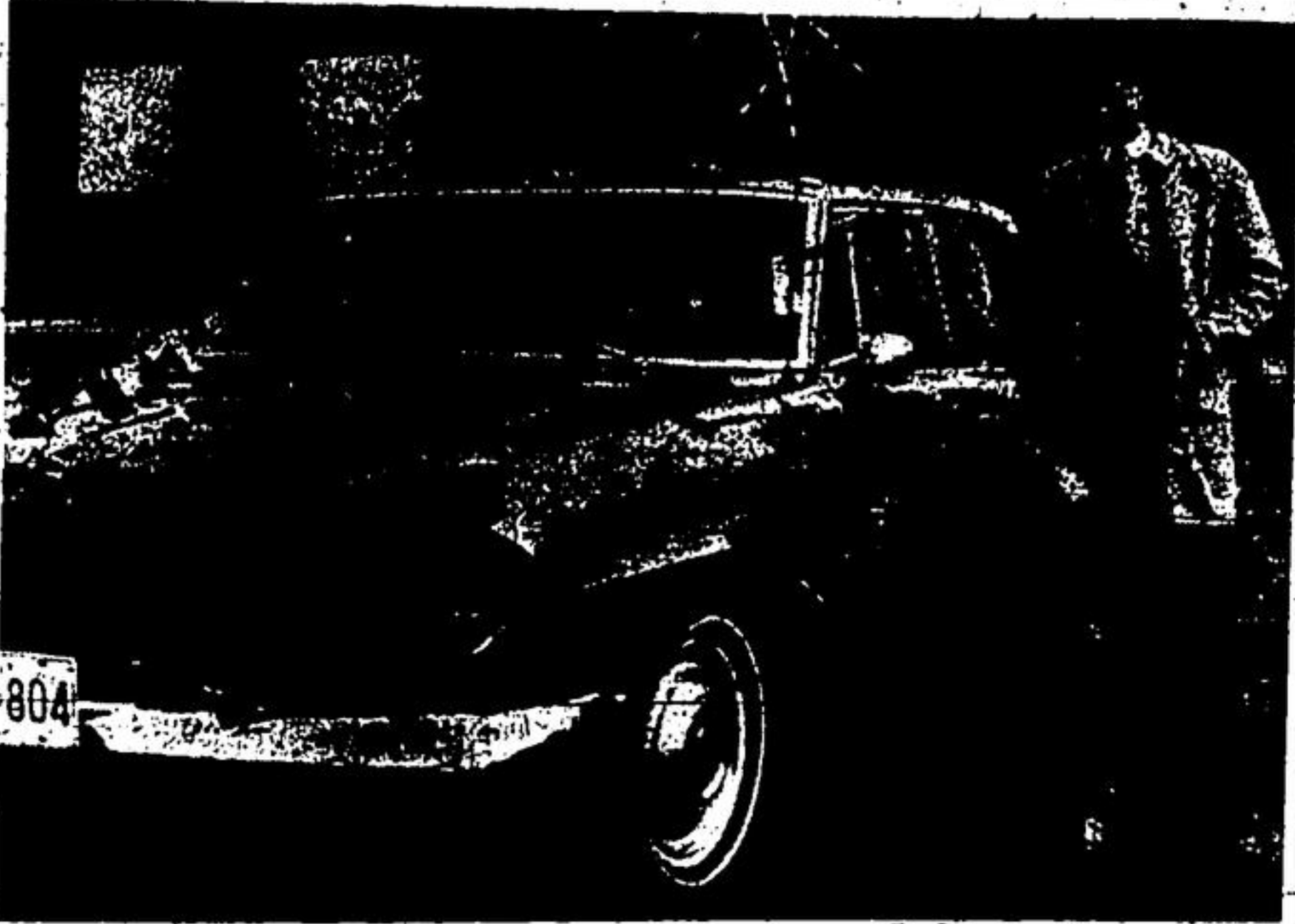


SUNDAY BELONGED TO THE SONS O'ERIN
