HOSPITAL NEWS

Last Thursday evening, the Hospital Association met for their annual meeting and election of officers. There was a fair crowd present for the meeting. As has been the custom for the past three years, the meeting was held in the Cafeteria of the hospital.

The meeting was opened by the president, and chairman of the Board, Magistrate John D. Ord, Q.C. who reviewed the year's proceedings and commented on various aspects of the accomplishments during the year. He asked those present to review the reports contained in the annual printed report and answered a number of questions involved, about the proposed expansion, accreditation, and the financial state. Magistrate Ord noted that this year's financial report was an excellent one, and that the very efficient way the hospital was run was indicated in the substantial savings made this year over budget.

The chairman stressed that of great concern was the proposed expansion, and that he felt the architects were not coming up with recommendations and plans fast enough, and this could cause a serious delay in building. He stressed this could not be allowed to happen, as the occupancy rate was causing the critical stage and did not seem to be alleviating in the least. Magistrate Ord thanked the association for the opportunity of being head of the group, and thanked all those who had helped during his years as chairman. He said that the next order of business would be the election of the Directors and that as Douglas Lattimer, Hospital solicitor had been slated to conduct the election, but was confined to hospital, he would ask John T. Armstrong to officiate. The former president of

Those elected for a further period on the Board, were the following four, Terry Baines, Leslie Clark, Magistrate Ord, and E. W. "Bus" Binkley. Mr. Binkley, a long time Georgetown resident, is the only newcomer to the Board, and is associated with Smith & Stupp Ltd. as chief of development and engineering.

The evening ended with the serving of refreshments and a social get-together. Apologies are due to our readers for the sparse coverage of what was an immensely interesting meeting.
