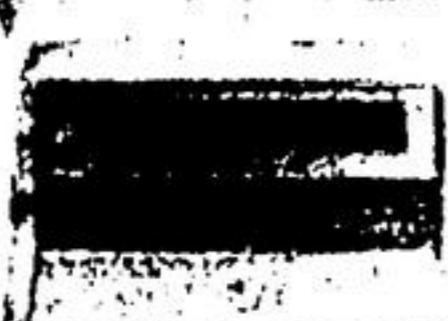

## Wants Hornby Speed Limit Set at 30 MPH for Safety

Reduction of the speed limit through Hornby to 30 miles per hour is the object of a petition being circulated by Mrs. Lillian Ayer. Mrs. Ayer is protesting the practice of speeding through the area after the family dog was struck and killed on the 7th Line near her home by a hit and run driver recently.

Motorists drive at 65 or 70 miles an hour in 50 mile zones and 45 or 50 miles an hour in 30 mile zones, Mrs. Ayer claims.

She points out that the corner of the Base Line and the 7th Line is dangerous and there are quite a number of children in the vicinity.

She notes that several cars have crashed into a house at the corner after failing to stop or turn when coming off the 7th Line.

A number of persons responded to Mrs. Ayer's request in contact her in regard to the circulation of a petition.

He was given 30 days to pay his fine.

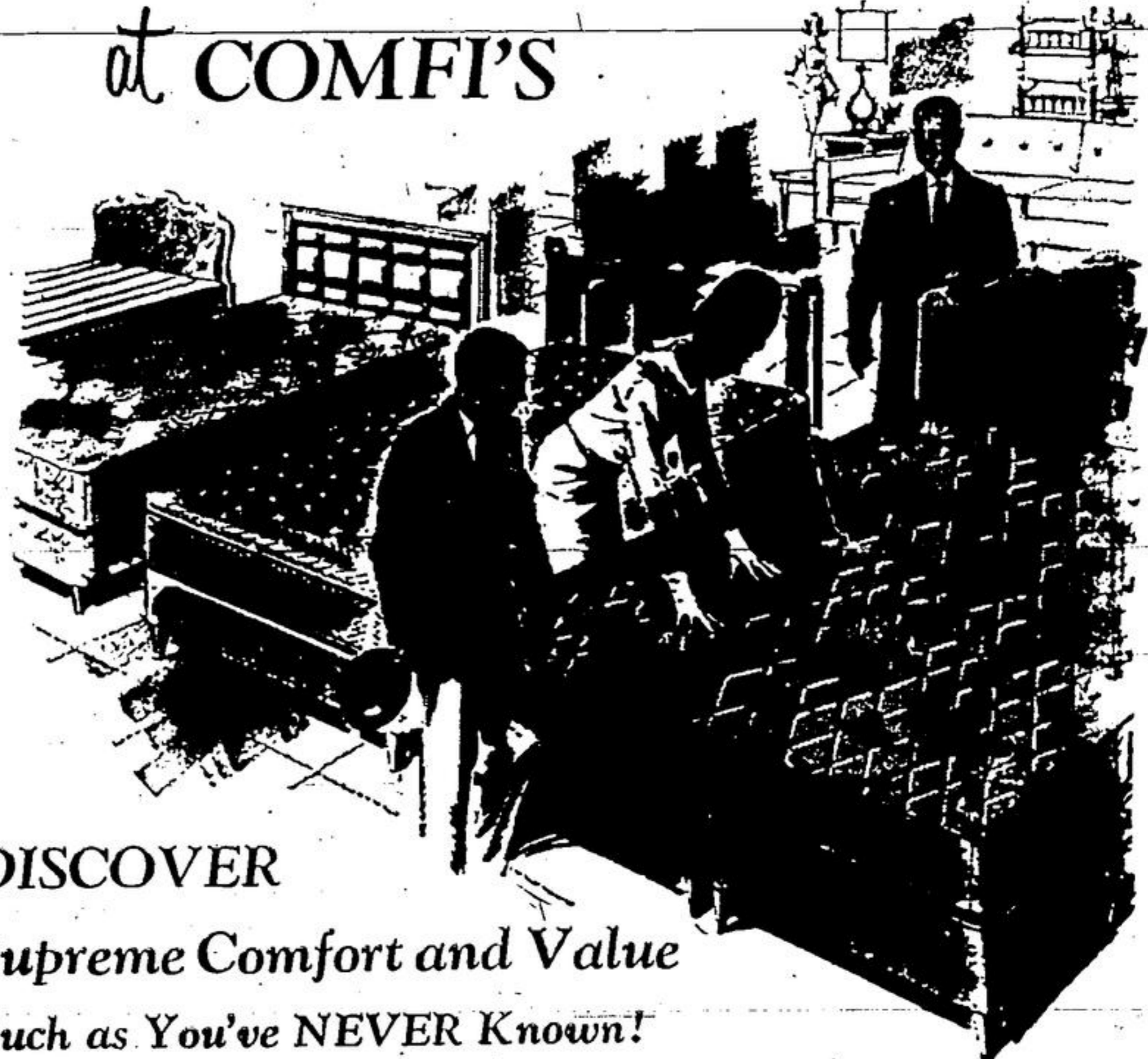
