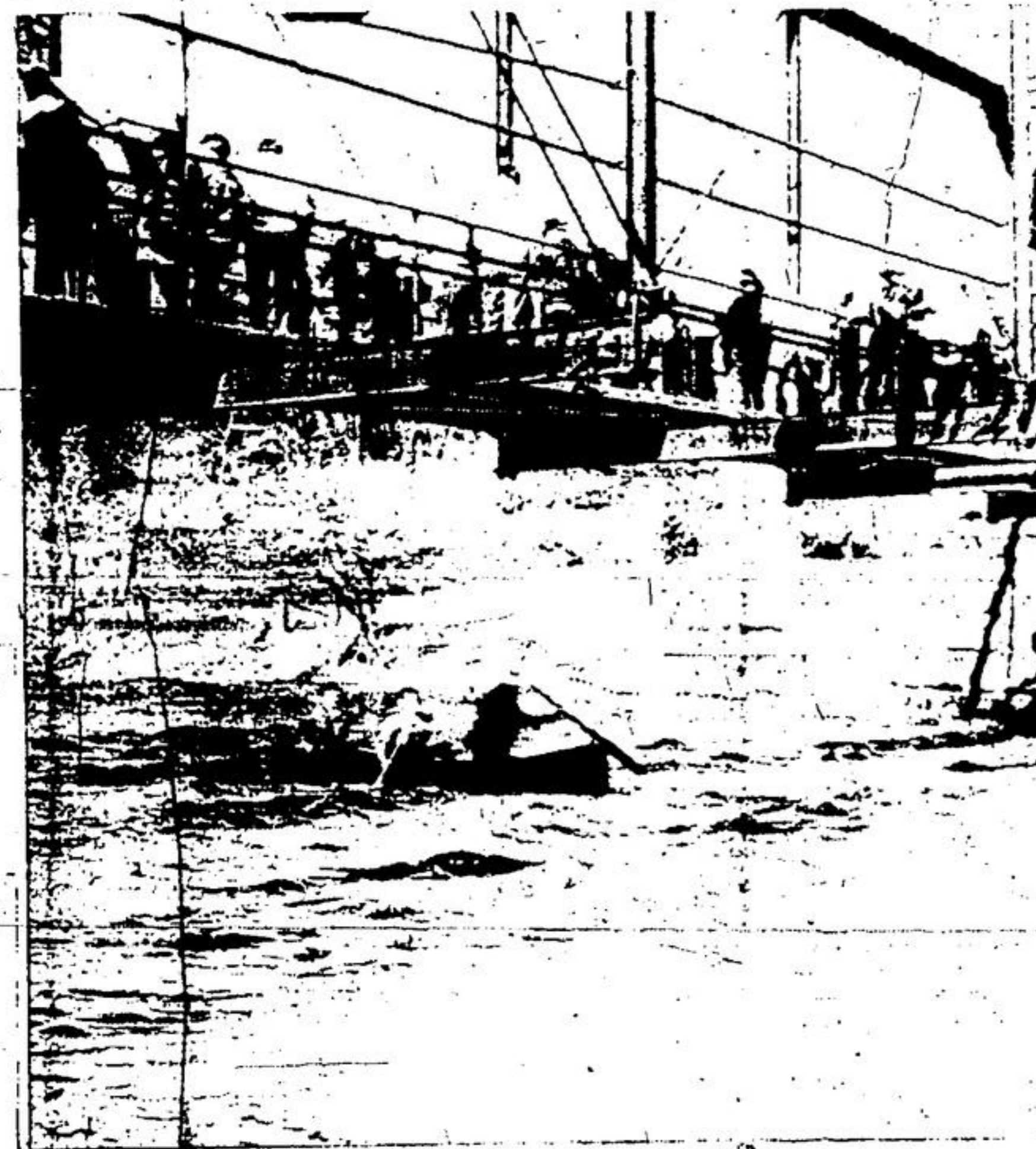

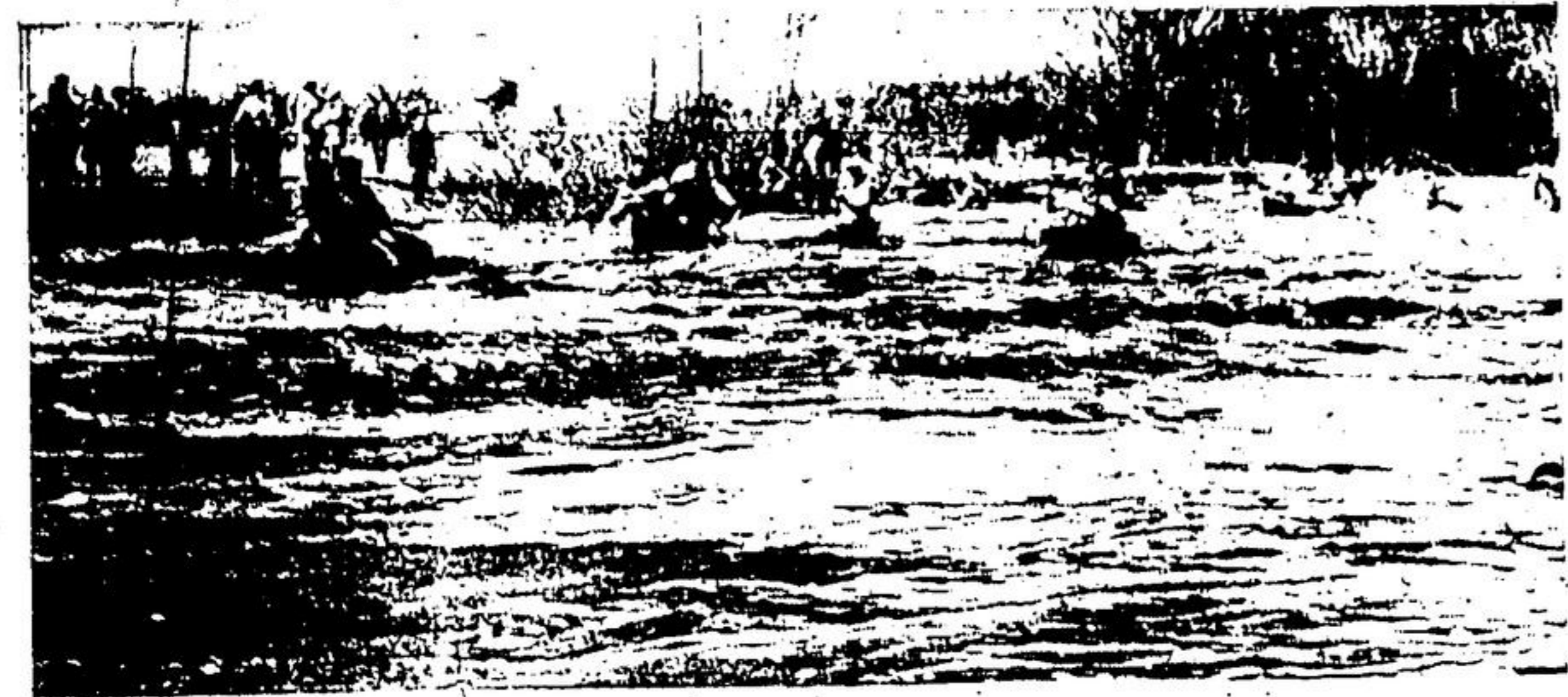
## Two Dozen "Boats" Go Cruising Down The River

Here they come. Boats of all descriptions, some of them home-made, pass under the 10th Line bridge at start of Crazy Boat Race.

Fifty oarsmen went punting on the Thames Saturday afternoon — sort of. Due to lack of funds and suitable transportation they settled for a muddy branch of the Credit River between Glen Williams and Norval, and for want of punts, participants shoved off in every kind of craft they could beg, borrow or haler-wire together.

It was all part of the Georgetown Jaycees' annual Crazy Boat Race in which survival and keeping your vessel afloat and in one piece take precedence over finishing first.

For the record, there were winners. Bernard Scholz and Alvin Le Taener, a couple of Sheridan Nurseries people, won the kayak class; Tom and Les DeForest and Wayne Dixon, all of Doerge Brothers, took honours in the regular class; and Jimmie Carney and Dan Hewitt rode their raft to the win in a class for "crazy boats." They were 24 entries.

In the first two classes the first to finish the seven mile course was the winner, but the crazy boat prize went to the finisher judged best by Jaycee officials. The Carney-Hewitt windjammer was a work of art made from a door, poly bottles, chicken wire and basket baskets.

The course started on Sheridan Nursery property near the 10th Line of Esplanade bridge west of Glen Williams, and the Riviera, Norval, was the finishing point.

The racers portaged twice, once at the lower mill dam on Georgetown's River Dr., and again at a dam in Norval village.

Almost all the competitors, many of them representing service clubs, went for involuntary swims during the trip, and one raft rider traversed the entire course waist deep in the chilling water. The course took from an hour to an hour and 45 minutes.

Jaycees Alex Presley and Walter Prime were race marshals.

Mayor Joseph Gibbons appeared to start the race and then disappeared the victim of a kidnapping caper by Etobicoke Jaycees. They returned his worship at 10:30 p.m.
