## COMING FOR PANEL FORUM

Reverend Ken W. Opperman, minister of Avenue Rd. Church, Toronto, will moderate the panel-forum on family relationships in Georgetown District High School, Saturday. The forum was arranged by Pastor Paul Collins of the Georgetown branch of the Christian and Missionary Alliance "to explore and discuss problems found in today's families." Also taking part as panelists will be:

Dr. Ed Edmund — a psychiatrist and director of the Detroit Psychiatric Hospital.

Miss Dorothy Shirk — high school teacher; head of the Guidance Department of the Waterloo Oxford Collegiate.

Dr. Charles Seidenspinner — educator; vice president of the Ontario Sunday School Association, and member of the Religious Broadcast Committee of CJOH TV in Ottawa.

Present at the head table were the regent and executive and 3 past regents Mrs. W. Thompson, Miss Hilda Erwin, and Mrs. Sam Penrice. Mrs. James Evans said the grace, and the members enjoyed a roast beef dinner.

Following the dinner a brief business meeting was held. The secretary read the minutes of the last meeting and in the absence of the treasurer, Miss H. MacDonald gave the report.

Miss Agnes Gollan, a Canadian Presbyterian Missionary, working in the besieged state of Biafra in Eastern Nigeria, spoke at the Easter Thank-Offering meeting in Knox Presbyterian Church recently.

Miss Gollan, a native of Kingston, Ontario, and a graduate of Queen's University, and the Missionary and Deaconess Training School, is home on furlough after her third tour of duty.

In 1960 Britain granted Nigeria her independence. Now because of deceit and corruption in the Federal government, the Ibos in the State of Biafra, have broken away and are seeking freedom as an individual state.

Because it is an internal situation the United Nations are unable to act and for some reason that has hurt and mystified Biafra, the Labour Government of Britain has not attempted to intervene and is, instead, supplying arms and munitions to Federal Nigeria.

Mr. Francis Ibam who was Governor of Nigeria at the time of her independence and who was knighted at that time by the Queen, has now renounced his knighthood as a protest to the British government's attitude.

Biafra, if given independence, would be the fifth largest country in all of Africa.

Miss Gollan told of some 30,000 Ibos murdered in Northern Nigeria, of the bombing of schools, hospitals and bridges, of the strafing of women and children. These bombings are being carried out by Egyptian pilots in planes supplied by Russia. She pointed out that mercenaries rarely care where their bombs fall so long as the pay load was dropped!

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Mrs. John Colter, the president, hosted the dessert luncheon meeting. Mrs. Cam Sinclair conducted the worship service and Mrs. Norman Young introduced Miss Gollan. Mrs. John Bird expressed the group's appreciation to Mrs. Fred Shortill and her daughter who accompanied her, for two beautiful solos.
