

Discuss Family Relationships COMING FOR PANEL FORUM

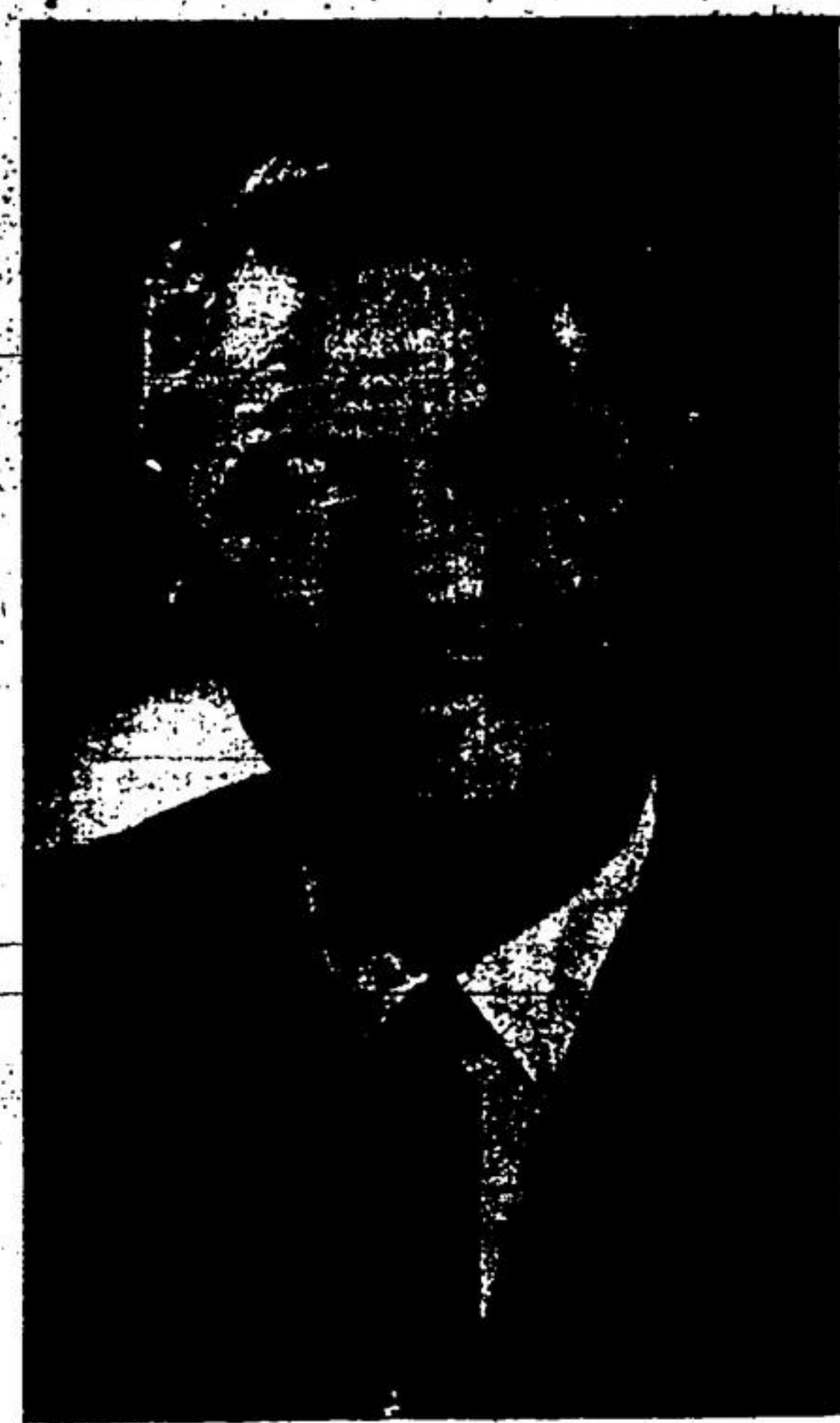

Troubles in Biafra are Detailed by Missionary

Miss Agnes Gollan, a Canadian Presbyterian Missionary, working in the besieged state of Biafra in Eastern Nigeria, spoke at the Easter Thank-Offering meeting in Knox Presbyterian Church recently.

Miss Gollan, a native of Kingston, Ontario, and a graduate of Queen's University and the Missionary and Diocesan Training School, is home on furlough after her third tour of duty.

In 1960 Britain granted Nigeria her independence. Now, because of deceit and corruption in the Federal government, the Ibo in the State of Biafra, have broken away and are seeking freedom as an individual state.

Because it is an internal situation the United Nations are unable to act and for some reason that has hurt and mystified Biafra, the Labour Government of Britain has not attempted to intervene and is, instead, supplying arms and munitions to the Federal Nigeria.

Biafra is completely cut off, and drugs and medical supplies are running low and according to the latest word the Red Cross plane has still not been allowed in.

She told of one Presbyterian minister, Rev. David Craig, being imprisoned for some time because he made the mistake of telling a road block he was a missionary, and they mistook it for mercenary. "After that," she said, "we were very careful to say we worked for the Church."

Sir Francis Ibiham who was Governor of Nigeria at the time of her independence and who was knighted at that time by the Queen, has now renounced his knighthood as a protest to the British government's attitude.

Biafra, if given independence, would be the fifth largest country in all of Africa.

Miss Gollan told of some 30,000 Ibos murdered in Northern Nigeria, of the bombing of schools, hospitals and bridges, of the starving of women and children. These bombings are being carried out by Egyptian pilots in planes supplied by Russia. She pointed out that mercenaries rarely cared where their bombs fell so long as the pay load was dropped!
