Hire Mitchell Firm to Negotiate for Property

Brampton's E. A. Mitchell real estate firm has been engaged by Georgetown to negotiate the acquisition of seven houses on Main Street north and portions of other properties required for replacement of the highway 'White Bridge.'

Council decided this on Monday on the advice of Reeve Hunter who, with Cr. Bill Smith, had been empowered last week to negotiate with owners.

The reeve said he had spent Saturday visiting with several owners and that while they all realize the necessity for the new bridge, they are understandably worried about their position in finding other accommodation.

"I asked council to meet as a committee tonight at 7:30," he said "and we decided that engaging the Mitchell firm is the proper step, rather than letting this become a political football."

He said a letter had been sent to all the house owners, giving details of the appraised value of all the properties.

Cr. Bob Francis said the time element is important and the matter should be concluded as fast as possible. He said the original estimates were made on house values in their existing locale.

Cr. Bill Smith also expressed concern that home owners do not suffer because of the project.

"What does the reeve mean by a letter," said Cr. Jim Young. "I've never seen it. As for an outside negotiator, I think the reeve and Cr. Smith can do a better job and people would rather deal with them."

Mayor Gibbons said he had sent a letter to all owners, giving each the appraised value of all the properties so they could make comparisons.

"I told you last week I was going to do this," he said. "They are going to be unhappy and they should be. I may be sending another letter — it's my privilege and my duty. There's no reason for this business to be private."

Terming it an invasion of privacy, Cr. Francis was critical of the mayor's actions.

"You haven't the right to tell a man the value of his neighbour's property," he said.

"You leave a meeting when you get in a spot," snapped the mayor. "You don't realize how little I worry about what this council thinks. How can you lead a council like this?"

OXFAM WALK

To speed up the collection task Oxfam walk organizers ask that pledges be paid in cheques or money orders if possible or at least in large bills. Walkers who can't get to the collection depot may mail their money directly to Oxfam of Canada, Royal Bank, Brampton.

Rod Watson of Brampton was first to finish the 30 miles after just 5 1/2 hours on the road. Not far behind him was a Georgetown boy, Glen Window, who was third to complete the walk.

Georgetown and district people made up a large percentage of the walkers and while it is impossible to list the several hundred who started, local people in Oxfam patrol cars report many from here among the 30 milers.

Volunteers who staffed the eight checkpoints at the Scout House on the Base Line, St. Stephen's Church, Hornby, Ashgrove United, Holy Cross Roman Catholic at Georgetown, Norval Presbyterian, Huttonville United, the EMO station, and St. Mary's Roman Catholic at Brampton also came in for heaps of praise from chairman Moulton.

"They were infected by the spirit of walkers and bent over backwards to see that their thirst, hunger, aches and blisters were attended to. Workers at all the checkpoints did an awful lot of work unselfishly and we're as proud of them as we are of those who walked," he said.

A mobile radio patrol kept the walkers under surveillance.
