(Continued from Front Page) pointing out that at least Mitchell Associates would be working on the settlement since they were appointed last week. But if Crs. Francis and Ballentine were appointed unwillingly, nothing would move at all.

The motion appointing Cr. Francis and Ballentine was defeated, on a three to five vote with Reeve Hunter Cr. Young and Cr. Hole voting for it to show, as they said they were behind the two men all the way.

Earlier in the meeting H. Vandenberg, Fred Tucker and Mr. and Mrs. Joe Emmerson, all residents of houses under expropriation asked council that the motion appointing Mitchell as negotiators be rescinded.

They claimed they did not know where they stood, and time was being wasted.

Mrs. Emmerson contended it was a waste of town money to have an outsider do the appraising. "You voted against Mitchell," she said to the mayor, "would you favour Reeve Hunter and Cr. Smith?" she asked.

"No, I think council should handle it at a meeting with the people involved," replied the mayor.

"Would you be there?" insisted Mrs. Emmerson.

"Yes, I won't wash my car that night," retorted the mayor. Last week Cr. Young accused the mayor of washing his car while an important budget meeting was taking place.

Cr Smith defended the Mitchell appointment, claiming he and the reeve had tried to think we are past the point of handling it ourselves, we need someone with experience in this kind of thing." He ended by warning it could drag for another year.

"I wanted a meeting with the property owners, so I sent them a letter" stated the mayor "I enclosed a copy of all the appraisals to everyone. I opposed Mitchell as appraiser, and I opposed him as negotiator, since it would make him look ridiculous if he changed his mind on prices in negotiations" concluded the mayor.

At the conclusion of the council meeting, another meeting with angry residents took place in the hall and continued on the sidewalk in front of the municipal building.
