

LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

It is just as important for the defense to make a plan as it is for the declarer to do so. The only difficulty is that the declarer can follow his plans through while the defense must rely on each other. Two defenders may make different plans. Some defense plays however, depend on one defender only. Here is an example.

East West are vulnerable and the dealer is North.

In spite of his excellent spade suit, South should start with one no trump. His hand is reasonably balanced and is worth 17 points - don't forget one extra for a five card suit. North's bid shows enough points for game and asks partner to bid 3 no trump without good heart support or bid 4 hearts with good heart support.

West was fortunate in getting off to a club lead. After three rounds of clubs, South is on the lead. While he decides his play, the defenders should do the

Underground Parking, Plaza Huttonville Apartments' Plan

Huttonville Park Apartments, an ambitious development program to house 3,000 persons with underground parking for about 1,400 cars, tennis courts, a 25,000 square foot shopping plaza and underground swimming pool, has been proposed to the Chinguacousy Planning Board.

The land is located between the Credit River and Embellion Drive and runs from the 4th Line West to the height of land near the Huttonville Public School, and is owned by Mr. Hazzell.

The area would take in the present undeveloped Huttonville Park.

The development would comprise a 15-20 storey towers at the corners of a hexagonal plan next to the road. The arms of the hexagon would be four-storey town houses. None of the tall towers would be on the river side of the development, giving occupants of the towers a clear view of the river.

The two lower floors of the 4 storey wings would face out onto the parkland bordering the river, and the two inner floors would face into the enclosed courtyard, and beneath the enclosed courtyard would be two levels of parking.

As the development came down the hill towards the 4th Line, the levels of the building would also be stepped down until the level of the Fourth Line was reached there would only be one level of underground parking.

At the junction of Embellion Drive and the Fourth Line, it is planned to erect a 25,000 square foot shopping plaza which can be reached by either above ground in the summer, or through a tunnel system underground in the winter.

In the basement of the shopping plaza at one end would be a curling rink and at the other end possibly a bowling alley or a billiard hall.

Name Thomas Acting Crown Attorney in Halton County

A 31-year old solicitor with the director of public prosecutions in Toronto has been appointed acting crown attorney for Halton.

He is Ronald G. Thomas. He took over from Peter K. McWilliams, who resigned to seek nomination as Progressive Conservative candidate for Halton in the June 25 federal election.

McWilliams, who served as crown attorney since 1958, was required to quit under a section of the Public Service Act. The resignation is permanent.

Mr. Thomas conducted his first batch of Halton cases in magistrate's court last week before Magistrate Kenneth Langdon.

Mr. Thomas said he will hold the position of acting crown attorney until the vacancy has been filled.

Asked whether he would apply for the permanent position in Halton, Mr. Thomas replied: "Whether or not I will be a particular applicant, I don't know yet."

Mr. Thomas has been a member of the criminal appeals and special prosecution branch of the department of public prosecutions.

Blind Vocalist, Vera Smith Will Visit Daughter Here

Vera Smith, a vocalist well known in northern England, since before the second World War, her husband Alan, and an amazing Labrador retriever named Kitty will arrive in Georgetown this weekend to be reunited with a daughter Mrs. Smith has never seen. She has been blind since 1944 two years before her twin daughter and son were born.

They will stay with her daughter and son-in-law Mr. and Mrs. M. Jackson, 7 Lewis Street, Georgetown, while they look for a home here. Their son is also living in Ontario.

Mrs. Smith, now living in Blackpool, was once a featured band singer and has continued to entertain at clubs despite her lack of sight. Kitty, a seeing-eye dog, or guide dog as they are termed in England, leads her on and off stage and generally takes the place of her eyes.

Because the Smiths are emigrating to Canada, Kitty has been going back to school to learn all over again how to cross the road. The three year old yellow retriever has been made to forget her curb drill and prepare for facing traffic which travels on the right hand side of the road.

Her trainer, Michael Csernovits, has to reverse this. In working with KITTY he has spent an entire day in a mask to have a better understanding of a blind person's reliance on the guide dog.

Mrs. Smith has been taking on hour's walk every day with KITTY who also takes her to the shops and Blackpool clubs where Mrs. Smith has sung at hundreds of charity shows.
