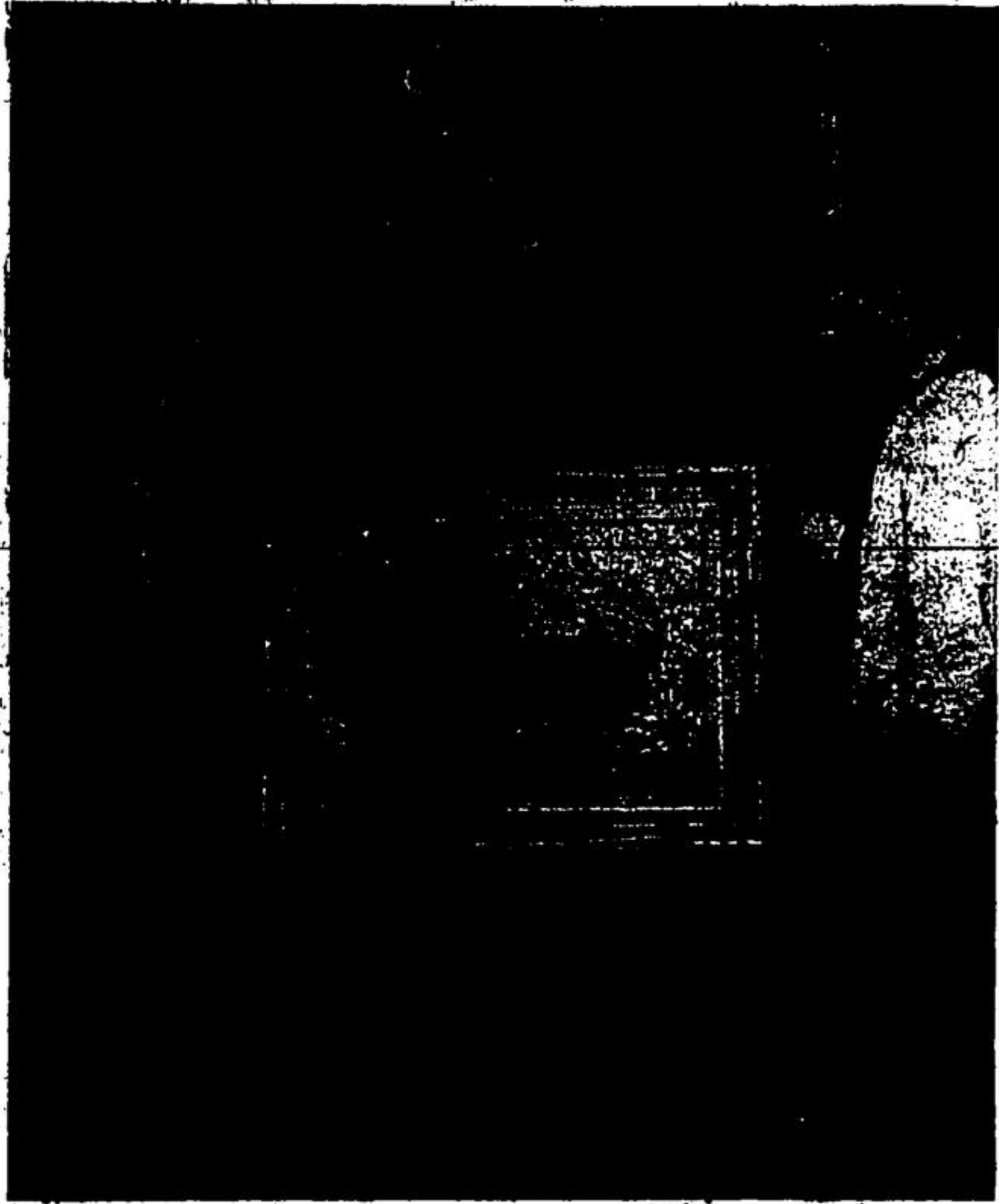


LANDSCAPES AT LIBRARY

Government Supplies \$1750 For Improvements to Park

The 500 acre Terra Cotta conservation area in Esquecing twp. will receive \$1,750 from the provincial government toward the installation of catch basins, culverts and drainage tile and enlarging the parking lot. The grant was one of four recently announced for the Credit Valley and Halton Region conservation authorities. The Credit Valley Conservation Authority will receive \$3,000 to help acquire more land for the 23 acre Belfountain area on the Credit River in Caledon township.

The land to be acquired has a frontage of 50 feet on both Pinnacle and Credit streets and a depth of 165 feet. It will permit construction of an entrance and roadway to the upper parking lot.

One thousand dollars is to be given to the 118 acre Meadowvale area on the Credit River at Meadowvale. The authority will use it for a development survey.

The Halton authority will get \$3,100 for capital improvements in the 1,040 acre Mountsberg conservation area at the headwaters of Twelve Mile Creek in Pualinch and East Flamborough townships. The area includes a 550 acre lake.
