

Fulton Promises Pollution Action if P-Cs are Elected

Former Conservative Justice Minister David Fulton said here Wednesday May 29, if his party wins the June 25 federal election it will attack the 'practical problems facing the country rather than the abstract ones the Liberals are concerned with.

DON'T MIX RADIAL, BIAS

With the new radial ply tires coming on the market in large quantities, the Canadian Highway Safety Council warns drivers never to mix them with the older conventional bias ply tires or bias-belted tires. If you're using conventional tires, use four. If you plan to buy radial tires, buy four. Actually, buy five, for even the spare should match. The reason for this warning is that the two types of tires behave differently when running and, if mixed, could throw an automobile out of control.

Blood—You Can Take It Apart But Can't Put It Together

The total quantity of blood in your body is about one pint for every fourteen pounds of your weight. This is more than adequate for your needs.

When you give a donation of blood to the Red Cross, you give about 1/2 of a pint. You can easily afford this loss and so can a person who has been injured or undergoes minor surgery. If you lose about 1 1/2 pints, however, this is too much of a shock to the system so it must be replaced as soon as possible. Besides, if you've lost that much through injury or surgery, you need every ounce of strength you can muster to recover. So, on the average, a person who needs blood gets at least two pints.

Blood is made up of two main components: blood plasma and blood cells. In a donation of blood there are about 27 billion white cells and 21 trillion red cells. White cells are the disease fighters in the body. Red cells, which give the blood its colour, are carriers of food, oxygen and water throughout the system. Blood plasma, a straw coloured liquid largely consists of water and protein.

If one donation of blood were analyzed, a chemist would find the following:

- Water — a brimming tumblerful
- Protein — 1/4 cup
- Fat — 1 1/2 teaspoons
- Salt — 1/2 teaspoon
- Minerals — 1/2 teaspoon
- Sugar — 1/2 pinch
- Oxygen Gas — 1 tennis ball full

The thing is, if we took all these things and put them together in a bottle, we simply would not have blood. Something's missing, and the something is that mysterious but wonderful thing called life.

Blood cannot be manufactured because man cannot manufacture life. Life can only be given by people through the giving of their blood. Giving blood is giving life. In this one deed we are endowed with the very power to life itself. Use it at the June 10th Red Cross Blood Donor Clinic.

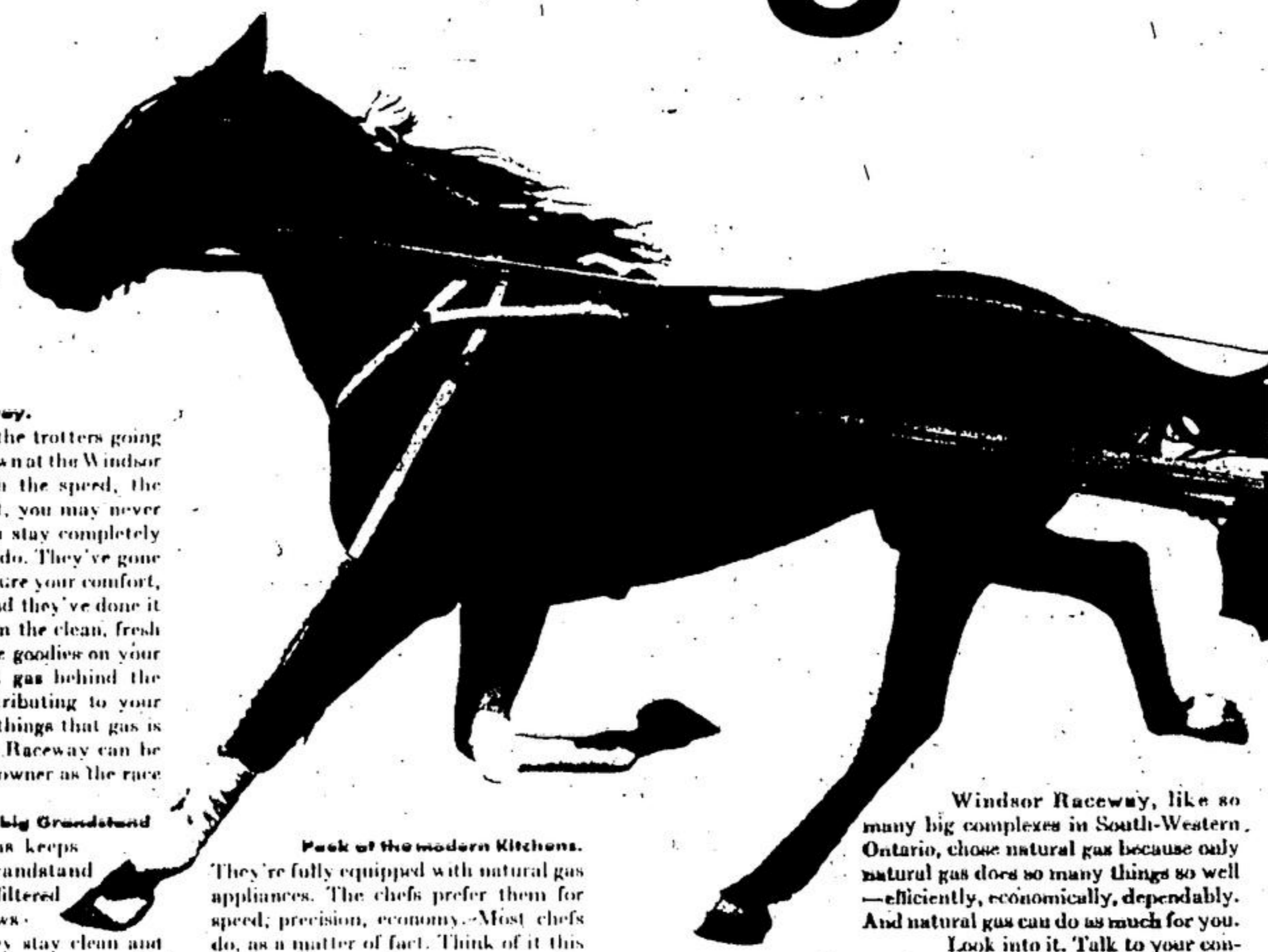
