### Drop Garage Requirement From By-Law on Parking

A new by-law aimed at reducing numbers of vehicles parked on private property, is still meeting mixed opinions from councillors.

On Monday, a clause requiring a covered garage for every two vehicles was eliminated from the by-law when Deputy Reeve Speight pointed out that many homes do not have the space to build a garage at all.

Mayor Gibbons said the solicitor has expressed doubt the by-law can be enforced and wants council to repeal it.

But a majority sided with Cr. Smith who said the intent is to stop old vehicles parked for months, and to avoid having large trucks parked in residential areas.
