

# GEORGETOWN COURSE PREPS FOR FAMOUS MILLAR GOLF TOURNEY

Entrants in the Carling Millar at Georgetown Golf & Country Club July 4, 5, and 6 will find a test for every part of their game. Preparation for the Millar has been going on since the old man winter peeled his blanket off Georgetown's rolling terrain. And with just two weeks to go greens superintendent Bobby Hall and his crew are focusing on grooming — keeping the greens like carpet, the fairways like broadloom, and the rough like shag rug.

Some of the most obvious improvements to the course to go familiar with it have been made to the sand traps — enlarging them and finishing them into saucer shaped beach-

Some new bunkers are so vast the pro shop should issue a compass with every score card in case a luckless duffer drops his approach shot in the middle of one of them.

Some of the club's money has been channelled into landscaping the clubhouse area, and members of the Millar galleries will notice many improvements in general appearance as well as to the playing area.

Even the front and back nines have traded some holes this season to make it a 72 par course, split 37 front and 35 back. Number 8, a killing dog, leg, uphill all the way, is 533 yards from tee to green and the longest hole on the course. I, of

## Keen Bantam Competition Sees Three Teams Tied

The goal scoring spree continued on Thursday night with Celtic losing to Rangers, 6-1. Rangers are a greatly improved team, and have some promising young players. Noel Watt obtained his second hat trick in this game, with Randy Hippen and Sam Watt scoring the remaining goals.

The last league game of the week was the most exciting game of the season, when Panthers and United fought to a 4-4 tie. Both these teams have some outstanding players, not least of whom are Panthers left half, Dave Baxter and United's right half Billy Maxwell who both gave excellent performances. George Watt of the United scored all 4 goals for his team, making him top scorer in the league, with a total of 14 goals in 5 games.

Etobicoke are Eastern Canada champions but this did not seem to worry the local lads who came home delighted with a 1-0 win. On Saturday, the Georgetown Bantams were also hammered when Chinguacousy beat them 7-0, but the boys were pleased to have a game, as it is proving very difficult to find opponents for them in this age group.

Georgetown Tigers were hosts to Milton Thistles on Tuesday evening and defeated them 8-0. The younger Halton lads put up a very good show, but tired in the second half.
