WATER RESTRICTIONS

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN BY-LAW NO. 68-46

A By-Law to further regulate the use of water notwithstanding the provisions of By-Law No. 68-40 and other by-laws.

WHEREAS Council is empowered to make regulations pursuant to the provisions of The Public Utilities Act, R.S.O. 1960, c. 331;

AND WHEREAS Council deems it expedient to enact regulations to secure to the inhabitants of the Town of Georgetown a continued supply of water at an adequate rate of flow and pressure;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Georgetown enacts as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other by-law of this Corporation to the contrary, in particular, the provisions of By-Law No. 68-40, no person shall use water by or through the water works of the Town of Georgetown for the following purposes:

(a) Lawn watering by any means
(b) Watering of flowers, shrubs, trees or other growing things except by means of a watering can, pail, or other container capable of being carried by one person;
(c) Washing of motor vehicles or vehicles of any kind except by means described in clause (b) but this clause shall not apply to vehicles being cleaned by a person already in the business, at the time of the passing of this by-law, of washing vehicles.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 (b) any persons already engaged at the time of the passing of this by-law in the business of farming, market gardening or the growing of flowers and shrubs in a nursery or greenhouse shall not be prohibited from ensuring adequate moisture for his stock, provided that there is no wastage of water.

3. Any person contravening the provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not more than \$300.00 exclusive of costs and every such fine shall be recoverable under the provisions of the Summary Convictions Act, R.S.O. 1960, c. 387.

BY-LAW READ a first, second, and third time and finally passed this 6th day of June, 1968.
