

Health Unit Nurses to Negotiate New Contract

Halton county nurses who walked off the job two years ago in a dispute with the board of health over contract negotiations will be negotiating another contract this fall.

Six members from the Halton County Nurses Association attended the nurses conference held last weekend to see what they could learn about collective bargaining.

"We are sincerely interested in keeping up to date with trends," said Mrs. Flora Hesson, president of the Halton County nurses association. "More

and more nurses should attend these conferences.

Proved a Point
She said that the walkout and the contract which they finally received was valuable. "It proved a point to all nurses in Ontario," she said.

Loveday Tuck, vice president of the Halton nurses association spoke of the walkout. "I don't think it did any harm," she said.

Halton nurses have a grievance before the health board now concerning part-time staff

and payment or mileage, but they agreed that conditions have improved.

After their walkout the Halton nurses stayed away from work for several weeks. They came back on the condition that the health unit would not hire any more nurses until contract disputes were settled. This "grey listing" was the focal point of a year-long argument. The health unit refused to bargain until the ban was lifted and the nurses refused to lift the ban until their contract was settled.

A provincial conciliator final-

ly settled the dispute August 31, 1967, after the Halton health nurses certified themselves as a bargaining unit.

During recent months there have been efforts on the part of county councillors to start action on amalgamating the Halton

and Peel health units. County officials have said that rising operating costs and wage scales make the merger desirable. They also complain they cannot individually hire enough nurses to staff the respective health units.
