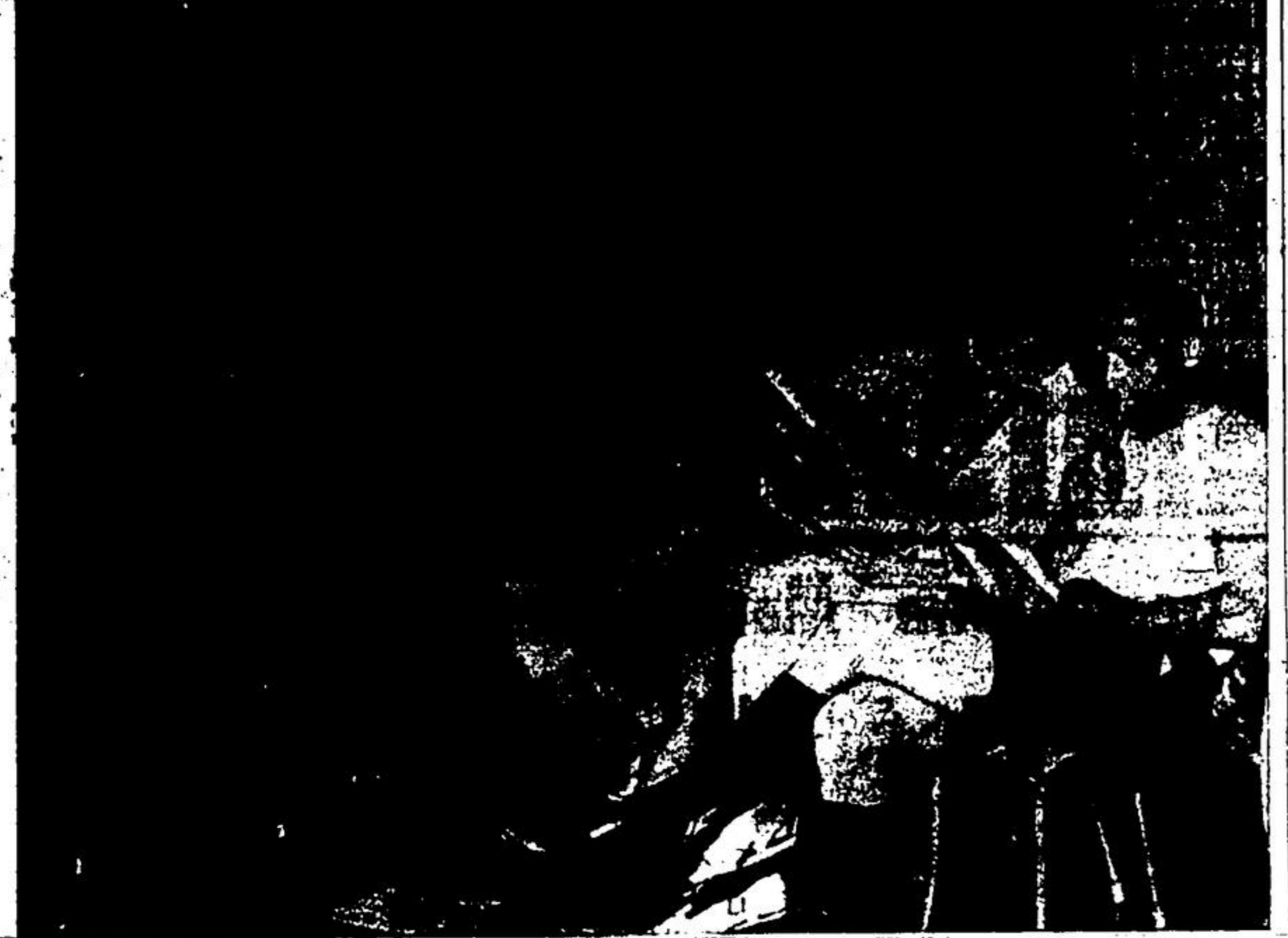

## LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

The take out double gives even good players a bit of trouble. One 'rule' that should be followed is this — when your partner makes a take out double, you can pass only if you are sure you can set the contract with a trump lead. The trouble when can you be sure?

Here is an interesting hand from the duplicate game at the Action Bridge Club last week. South was the dealer and North-South were vulnerable.

open. West doubled to get his partner to bid his best suit. East decided to convert this to a penalty-double. South passes with some reluctance but there was no place to escape to.

On the opening lead, dummy played low. East put in the nine and declarer won with the king. A heart was led and West won the lead. The club queen was led, declarer winning. Another heart was led by declarer and West won again. The club ace let East discard a heart.

Now West led a heart but declarer ruffed high in dummy. A spade was led and the nine played from South's hand. West was on the lead again. A high club won the trick but on the next club East ruffed so that declarer could not make his trump decoy. Declarer overruffed with the ace and cashed the ace of trump.

Declarer now put East on the lead with his small diamond and made the spade ace later. Down one for a fine result. Must 200 points when the opponents had game their way.

Perhaps East, West could have done a bit better if East had won the first heart and led a club. The difference between one down and two down doubled and vulnerable is 300 pts.
