

County Structure Could be End of Municipal Councils

A new municipal government structure that would be run at county level seemed possible following a meeting of Halton county officials last week.

A special committee of council was set up to bring forward a new plan for regional government in Halton after it appeared the Plunkett Report recommendations would not be carried out in full.

The committee met on Thursday behind closed doors at the county building to hear what W. V. Guardhouse, an official involved in the formation of Metro Toronto, had to say about the reshuffle.

Definite Course
The committee feels it can now pursue some definite course in its studies, a member said afterwards.
