One farmer's wife put some in the freezer for proof of the size of them.

It did not last long, for which everyone was thankful but perhaps gave an idea of the terrible hail storms we hear they experience in the west.

Apparently the village did not experience it — only a narrow band extending from north west to the east.

Provincial Police Weekly Report

Officers of the North Halton Detachment, Ontario Provincial Police during the week of June 23 to June 29th inclusive, investigated 7 miscellaneous driving complaints. 1 driver was charged with driving while under suspension. 3 family complaints were investigated along with one hunting on private property complaint. 2 liquor complaints were received resulting in 1 person being charged with having liquor in a place other than his residence. 2 malicious damage complaints were received. 2 reports of cattle loose and 1 report of garbage dumped on private property.

A total of 13 accidents were investigated including 3 injury accidents resulting in 3 persons being injured. Property damage totalled \$8,225. Causes of accidents were: inattentive driving, driver losing control and speed too fast for road or traffic conditions.

There were 4 charges laid as a result of the above incidents.

During this period officers patrolled a total of 9,855 miles on area highways, preferred 72 charges, issued 58 warnings and conducted 84 safety checks.

There were 167 convictions registered in Magistrate's Court.
