

25 Yrs. Clerk-Treasurer K. C. Lindsay Honored

A quarter century of service as an Esqueing municipal officer was acknowledged on July 19 when township officials feted K. C. Lindsay at a dinner and presentation at Milton's Caravan Restaurant.

Mr. Lindsay has been clerk-treasurer for 25 years. A former councillor Ed Harrop paid tribute to Mr. Lindsay's years of service, pointing out his willingness to work, his honesty in all his dealings and his ability to get along with people as prime assets for his job.

Presenting an engraved desk set, Reeve George Currie reviewed changes in the township during the 25 years. He recalled that he is the only living member of the council which engaged Mr. Lindsay for the job.

Mr. Lindsay is only the fifth treasurer in the township's 118 year history. Norman Thompson served the three previous years and George Leslie for 23 years, from 1897.

BRAMPTON—Parcel express has doubled since the start of the postal strike, said Keith Vokoy of the Grey Coach express office on George Street. "But sending letters by parcel express to points in Canada is expensive. They must have the regular postage on the back, and then to this is added our cost for carrying them which is determined by mileage and weight," he explained. "Letters sent this way are classified as parcels of less than two pounds and there is a minimum charge of \$1.25 for the first 125 miles," he continued.
